

GARDEN STATE VS. TEMPE

Game 1

Garden State 000 001 000 - 1 1 0 W-Maddux L-Saberhagen
Tempe 102 000 00x - 3 9 0 HR-none GW-Tettleton

Greg Maddux completed a one hitter, allowing 5 walks and striking out 4 to get the victory in game one. Jose Oquendo and Mark Grace each had 3 hits to spark the Tigers' 9 hit attack.

Game 2

Garden State 300 001 200 1 - 7 11 5 W-Knudson L-Reardon
Tempe 002 120 001 2 - 8 13 0 HR-Williams GW-V.Hayes

The Stallions jumped out to an early lead behind an rbi single by Dan Gladden and a 2-rbi single by Jim Eisenreich. The Tigers came bouncing back with a 2-rbi single by Grace in the 3rd. Tempe tied it in the 4th when Mickey Tettleton reached on Bill Doran's error and scored on Gino Petralli's wild throw. The Tigers stole 8 bases in the game, virtually running themselves to a win. They stole 2 in the bottom of the 10th. Garden State's 5 errors figured in heavily also, including a 10th inning miscue that put a runner on 3b to set up Von Hayes game winning sacrifice fly. Gladden led the Stallions with 3 hits. Brett Butler and Grace each had 3 for the Tigers with Grace collecting 4 rbi.

Game 3

Tempe 102 010 001 - 5 5 1 W-Knudson L-Agosto S-Henke Garden State 002 110 000 - 4 10 0 HR-none GW-Butler

The Tigers won their third straight even though they were held to just 5 hits. Von Hayes drove in 3 runs and Butler had the game winning rbi single in the top of the 9th. Mark Knudson won his second straight pitching 3 innings of shutout ball before yielding in the 9th to Tom Henke. George Brett and Gino Petralli each collected 2 hits including a triple apiece to lead the Stallions' 10-hit attack.

Game 4

Tempe 100 010 000 - 2 6 0 W-Saberhagen L-Maddux Garden State 102 000 01x - 4 12 2 HR-none GW-Brett

Bret Saberhagen turned the tables on Greg Maddux in this one. He fanned 5 and walked only one in a 6 hit complete game. Five Stallions had two hits each to dominate this game with a dozen hits.

Game 5

The Stallions pulled out this pitchers duel as Greg Gagne's one out rbi single in the 7th plated Jim Eisenreich who walked and stole 2b. Mike Scott pitched a strong 8 innings, allowing only 4 hits while fanning 3 batters for the win. Jeff Reardon closed down the 9th after a shaky beginning. Jose Oquendo singled, stole second, but then tried to go to 3b on Tettleton's deep fly to center, but Gagne's relay throw from Eisenreich nailed him at 3b.

Game 6

Things looked grim for the Stallions. They were faced with the near impossible. They lost the first 3 straight, and now they were down 3-2 with two games remaining at Tempe. The league's best team the past two seasons. To top it off, the Tigers exploded for 7 runs in the first 3 innings behind the hot bats of Butler, Grace and Hayes. The Stallions then broke loose with 5 in the 5th as Bill Doran led off with a triple. He then scored on Pat Sheridan's pinch-hit double. Tommy Gregg then doubled, Dave Magadan singled and Gregg scored on Brett's infield ground-out. Craig Biggio fanned and Gladden was hit by a pitch to set up Eisenreich's two rbi triple. Matt Williams clobbered a John Franco offering in the 6th for a two-run shot to put the Stallions up to stay and tie it at 3 games apiece.

Game 7

Well, the stage was set. One team's season would end and the other would advance to the Series. Both teams had their aces going, each having won one game already in the playoffs. Craig Biggio got things going for the Stallions with a 2 rbi double in the first after Gregg and Brett both reached on singles. Dave Magadan and Biggio each drove in another run in the 5th to put this one out of reach. The Garden State Stallions did what the Tigers did in last year's World Series, win the last 4 after dropping the first 3. Brett and Biggio each had two hits for the Stallions. Danny Heep led the Tigers with half of their hits.

Game 1

The Warhawks' pitching staff shut down the Arrows with only 5 hits in 14 innings. They jumped out 1-0 in the first when Jeff Kunkel doubled home Luis Polonia who was hit by Joe Magrane and stole second. The Arrows didn't even get a hit until Nelson Liriano got a two out single in the 7th. Paul O'Neill tied the game for the Arrows with a single in the 8th. The Arrows ran into Don Aase who allowed only one hit in the last 3 innings and sat down the last 7 batters in order for the win. Polonia single in Domingo Ramos with two outs in the 14th.

Game 2

Lance Johnson, Mackey Sasser and Kelly Gruber each had 3 hits, 2 rbi and 2 runs scored. Rick Sutcliffe pitched a complete game allowing 5 hits, striking out 5 and giving up only 1 earned run.

Game 3

Dave Smith got to return the favor to Don Aase in this one. Bruce Hurst started against John Farrell and left with a 5-3 lead. Ed Whitson completed a hitless inning before yielding to Arrow ace Rob Dibble. Dibble was shelled for 3 hits and 2 runs in 0.2 innings to send it into extra innings. Tony Pena then belted a one out offering from Aase in the 10th to win it. Four Warhawks had two hits each and Sasser had two for ARA.

Game 4

The Arrows jumped out to a 7-1 lead after four innings behind Paul O'Neill's 2 homeruns and 5 rbi. The Hawks came roaring back in the 5th as a walk to Jeff Kunkel tallied a run just before Dave Henderson hit a 3-rbi double. Barry Lyons then completed a perfect 3-3 day by hitting a 2 run shot to knot it at 7. The Arrows

bullpen then shut Wagram down with only one hit the rest of the way. In the bottom of the 10th, Jeff King drilled a one out pitch over the wall for a game winning homerun. Fred McGriff led Arizona with three hits in 5 trips.

Game 5

Rick Sutcliffe continued to dazzle the SWBA by beating Mike Moore for the second time in this playoff series. He got a balanced hitting attack from his team as 5 Arrows each had two hits apiece. Luis Polonia had 4 hits and Julio Franco 3 hits for the Warhawks, which makes it hard to score runs. Sutcliffe struck out 5, walking none and allowing 4 hits in 5 innings. Only one run was earned. This sent the Arizona Arrows to the World Series for the first time.

Joe Magrane scattered 8 hits, allowing only 1 earned run and was aided by defense as Lance Johnson ran down a deep fly to the warning track that prevented a 2-2 in the first inning. Paul O'Neill went 4-5 with 3 rbi including a homerun. Three more Arrows had 2 hits apiece as the Arrows ran away with this one.

Game 2

Rick Sutcliffe won his third game of the post-season, pitching 6 innings, allowing 5 hits, 1 run and striking out 4. With the teams tied at one in the 7th, Greg Gagne's two out error allowed Mackey Sasser to score and kept the inning alive for Roberto Kelly's 2-rbi single. Bret Saberhagen lost a heart-breaker. He allowed only 1 earned run in 8 innings, while fanning 8 and giving up 6 hits. Sasser had two hits for Arizona. Dave Magadan and Jim Eisenreich each had two for Garden State. Arrows lost Ed Whitson until game 6.

The Stallions broke through finally in this 13 inning marathon. Greg Gagne redeemed himself for his error in game 2 by going 3-5 and hitting a 2 out dinger to win it. Paul O'Neill was the Arrows' offense, going 5-5 with a homer and 3 rbi. The Stallions' bullpen allowed only two Arrow baserunners over the last four innings to pick up the win. The Arrows were hurt again, losing starter Bruce Hurst and Kelly Gruber to injuries.

Game 4

The Stallions tied up the series behind a 14 hit attack and good pitching from Pete Smith. GSS jumped all over Joe Magrane with 11 hits in 5.2 innings to tag him with the loss. Danny Gladden was 3-5, Greg Gagne 2-5, Craig Biggio 2-4 and Jim Eisenreich 2-5 to pace the visitors. Only Nelson Liriano had two hits for the Arrows. Smith scattered 7 hits, fanned 5 and didn't walk any in 7 innings.

Game 5

Finally a home team won a game in the series. Old man Rick Sutcliffe continued his post-season wizardry, beating Saberhagen for the second time. Rick completed a 3 hitter, fanning 6 and walking 4. Roberto Kelly and Jeff Blauser supplied the offensive support with two hits each. Dan Gladden had 2 of Garden State's 3 hits.

Game 6

The "comeback kids", the Garden State Stallions, were facing elimination. They had the Arrows right where they wanted them after Mike Scott's two out rbi double gave them the lead. The Stallions "threw a shoe" in the 8th as Fred McGriff's 2 run shot sparked a 4 run inning. Jeff Blauser, Paul O'Neill and Greg Gagne each had two hits apiece. Ed Whitson got the win, coming off his injury in time to get the start for Bruce Hurst. Ed tossed 7 innings of 5 hit ball, walking no one and whiffing 3 Stallions. Rob Dibble came on to shut out GSS over the last two innings for the save. The Arizona Arrows became the third team to win the SWBA Championship in its three year history.

Arizona Arrows

Finally, after 9+ seasons of play-by-mail baseball, manager Joe Hornback has won a championship. The 1990 Arizona Arrows finished with a 95-67 record, second in the West Division. The Arrows were 49-32 at home, 46-35 on the road. The road record and championship earned Hornback Coach and General Manager of the Year honors.

Pitching is what set this year's version of the Arrows apart from previous teams. Hornback knew he had a strong 1-2-3 punch of Joe Magrane, Ed Whitson and Bruce Hurst going into the season. He dealt for a 4th starter by acquiring veteran Rick Sutcliffe prior to the season opener. This proved to be the key move as Sutcliffe battled for team "ace" honors by posting a 17-9 record and 3.51 ERA. Joe Magrane barely missed becoming the Arrows' first 20 game winner, finishing at 19-5 with a 3.39 ERA. Bruce Hurst managed 16 wins despite a 4.13 ERA. Another key move before the beginning of the season saw the Arrows ship middle-man Duane Ward to Kodiak for stopper Rob Dibble. Despite an unexpectedly high ERA of 3.81, Rob responded with an 8-6 record and team record and league leading 41 saves. Dibble also managed to fan 13.32 batters every 9 innings. Danny Darwin (2.70, 7 saves), Cris Carpenter (2.60, 7-2 record) and Dave Smith (3.13, 7-2, 5 saves) rounded out the remainder of a good pitching staff.

Offensively, Fred McGriff finally posted some decent homerun numbers, belting 31, while scoring 102 times, driving in 97 runs and leading the league with 113 bases on balls. Kelly Gruber made the SWBA second all-star team by batting .276 with 21 homers and 123 rbi(23 GW). Paul O'Neill was second in RF balloting by hitting .281 with 15 HR, 78 rbi and 34 steals. The Arrows stole 233 bases while getting caught only 85 times. Roberto Kelly (.309, 11 HR, 90 runs, 67 steals) and newly acquired Barry Bonds (.261, 17 HR, 92 runs, 66 rbi, 75 BB, 64 steals) finished 2nd and 3rd respectively to Rickey Henderson. Part-time contributions came from Carmen Castillo (.311, 13 HR in 206 AB, .641 Slug Pct), #1 draft pick Lance Johnson (.306, 16 doubles, 19 SB) and Mackey Sasser (.302, 17 doubles).

The Arrows started off slow, finishing with an 11-15 mark after the first round. They turned it around with a 15-8 second round, 19-12 third round, 18-10 fourth round, 17-14 fifth round and closed out the division opponents 15-8 in the sixth round. Arizona closed out the season with their longest winning streak of 7 games. The Arrows never lost more than 4 games in a row. The Arrows were 4-5 in extra inning contests and 28-19 in one run games. Arizona broke ten runs 15 times, while opponents only did it 6 times. In series #40 versus Tempe, Arizona posted consecutive scores of 10-9, 10-2, and 11-6. On the season, Arizona tallied 781 runs for an average of 4.82. Despite this great season, the Arrows franchise is still tied for 7th among the 12 original teams with a .504 winning percentage.

Wagram Warhawks

The 1990 Warhawks were the most balanced team Wagram has put on the field in their three seasons in the SWBA. They set team records for batting average (.276), runs (818), doubles (295) and stolen bases (157). The pitching was also strong with a team best 3.77 earned run average and 10 shutouts.

The offense was led by Julio Franco's .323 average and Bobby Bonillas' 23 homeruns and 115 RBI. Bonilla also hit .285 and was the team MVP. The Warhawks major offen-sive problem was the lack of the long ball, hitting only 126 dingers, a three year low. Mel Hall was the biggest surprise, hitting .318, with 18 HR and 97 ribbies in only 371 at-bats. Luis Polonia had another fine year, hitting .324 with 45 steals, 4 short of his own team record. Polonia has been an excellent lead-off hitter, averaging .307 in his three years with the Warhawks.

The team pitching improved 52 points in ERA over their 4.29 mark in 1989. Mike Moore, the Hawks' number 1 draft pick, was no disappointment as he won 20 games with an ERA of 3.45. Roger Clemens put in an average year for him, after having tons of injury problems early, he rebounded with a 17-8 mark and an ERA of 3.25. The bullpen was run by committee with Dave Righetti being the main man with only 13 saves. Jeff Parrett saved 15 before being traded, but lost 6 games and had an ERA of 5.20. Greg Harris had a solid year with an ERA of 2.82 in 80 games.

The Warhawks acquired Dion James and Jeff Kunkel during the season, with Kunkel being a flop. James was a major contributor, hitting .330 in 103 at-bats and filling in at first and in the outfield.

Looking forward to the draft, the Warhawks will be on their annual search for a third baseman. The weak catching situation may have been solved in an off-season trade with the Mobile franchise. Wagram sent Todd Stottlemyre and their number one for Joe Girardi, Todd Benzinger and Roy Smith. The Warhawks traded Julio Franco to Arizona for Bruce Hurst and Nelson Liriano. GM Firman made a major blunder in this deal, thinking Manny Lee but talking Liriano. You live and learn!

The Warhawks are looking forward to the draft and the upcoming season.

Garden State Stallions

The inaugural season of this expansion team was quite more than anyone could have expected. Finishing first in the East was a big surprise, but almost winning it all was more than anyone could have imagined.

When the expansion draft took place this club chose a pitchers' ballpark, Royals Stadium, and of course, pitching. Three of the first four players chosen were pitchers: Bret Saberhagen, Tom Gordon and Mike Scott. This tactic seemed to be the right move. Saberhagen topped the staff with 19 wins, 2.59 ERA and 5 shutouts. In relief, Larry Andersen posted an impressive record of 13-1 with 10 saves. Jeff Reardon, acquired in a trade with Minnesota, pitched in with 20 saves. Veteran Kent Tekulve even posted a 2.09 ERA and 10 saves for the Stallions.

While the pitching soared with a team ERA of 3.41 and a league recordsetting mark of 1100 strikeouts, the hitting was, to say the least, sub-par. (.242 avg. with 120 HR) Most of the homerun power came from rookie Matt Williams' 20 HR in 248 AB. Another league record that the Stallions surpassed was the stolen base record of 197 set by California the previous year. The Stallions stole 202. The big difference was when the pitching kept the Stallions in the game, the offense got the big hits when they needed them.

While finishing first in the East was a huge accomplishment, the task of facing the 2 toughest teams in the league stood before the Stallions in the playoffs. After falling behind to the defending champs, the Tempe Tigers, 3 games to none, Saberhagen and the gang got going to rally back to defeat them in 7. Seemed like dejavu to the Tigers from last year's World Series.

In the finals, it was keep away from the home field, as only 1 game was won by the home team. Arizona was too overpowering and took the expansion team in 6 games, but it was a hard-fought series, which should blossom into a fierce rivalry in the future.

For the future, the Stallions need to bring much-needed punch to the lineup if they intend to repeat as East Champions. The MVP award of the season went to Saberhagen, who missed winning 20 games by not getting the decision in his last 3 starts.

The Sagebrush Seminoles rode good pitching and good hitting to a 92-70 record, 3 games out of a playoff spot. The .270 batting average the Seminoles posted was second only to the Wagram Warhawks, their Central Division foes. They also posted the leagues 5th best ERA at 3.61.

Chris Bosio was again the stud of the Indians' staff. He finished with a fine 18-6 record and 3.02 ERA. The tribe got double figure wins from Roger McDowell, Tim Leary, Clay Parker and Bob Welch. McDowell was the right-handed bullpen ace, finishing with a 2.91 ERA and 19 saves. Lee Guetterman, his left-handed counterpart, posted a 5-3 record, with 9 saves, and team highs of 2.61 ERA and 68 games.

Offensively, George Bell was the "do-it-all" man for SBS. He hit a solid .295, with 34 doubles, 27 dingers, 102 runs and 112 rbi. Nick Esasky also played long ball, hitting 39 for the distance while batting .266 and driving in 98. Rookie Junior Felix got to play everyday and posted some good numbers. He batted .260, with 13 triples and 16 homeruns to finish second in Rookie of the Year balloting. Ozzie Smith was his usual steady influence, hitting .281, with 36 doubles, 91 runs, 56 steals and a .357 on-base percentage.

The Seminoles were great at home, running up a 60-21 advantage. They really suffered on the road though, finishing at 32-49. The longest losing streak SBS suffered through was 5 games. They finished out the season on a 13-3 tear including a 12 game winning streak.

Chicago Spirit

Bill Samuels led his team to another impressive season. His team finished at 89-73, third place in the West Division. The Spirit had a good blend of hitting and pitching that kept them in the thick of it most of the year. Mediocre second and third rounds of the season pretty much kept them in their third place slot.

The Spirit pitching staff was by committee. Only two pitchers achieved double digits in victories. Tom Candiotti was the starting ace, posting a 13-8 mark with a 3.40 earned run average. Bud Black led the team in wins with 14 against 7 losses and posted a 3.71 mark. Chicago benefitted by having a pair of stud relievers. Chuck Crim was the setup man, going 6-4 with a 2.96 ERA. When it came time for the fat lady to sing, Norm Charlton strutted in from the bullpen where he boasted a 5-4 record with 32 saves and a low, low 1.79 ERA. The Spirit were about one good starter from being a playoff team.

At the plate, Tony Gwynn was the man. He turned in an all-star performance in CF. Tony grooved out a .337 average, with 209 hits, 33 doubles, 9 triples, 105 runs scored and 41 stolen bases. Greg Brock led the Spirit with 18 homeruns. B.J. Surhoff posted a .278 average, with 22 doubles, 6 triples, 9 homeruns and a team-leading 78 rbi. Chris James (.303) and John Kruk (.299) turned in good platoon seasons. Roberto Alomar turned in a solid sophomore season batting .293 with 27 doubles. Overall, the team batting average of .269 was third in the SWBA.

The longest losing and winning streaks were both 5 games. At the end of the season, manager Bill Samuels announced his retirement. He leaves the SWBA with the second best record of any of the 12 original coaches. His mark in three seasons was 262-224, a .539 winning percentage.

Delaware Destroyers

The Destroyers hoisted anchor and set sail at the start of the 1990 season and were abruptly met by choppy seas, high winds and finally a full-fledged typhoon. This disastrous start caused the former owner to abandon ship. The following transition period brought its own set of problems to solve, including a long slate of make-up games and calculations as to where players stood respective to at-bats and innings pitched. The Destroyers weathered the storm and reached port right on schedule with the rest of the league.

The Destroyers, for all their initial problems, managed to finish four games above .500 and in second place in the Eastern Division. A personal managerial record was set when current ownership reeled off ten consecutive victories upon taking helm of the Destroyer ship. Highlights of the year; Steve Sax ended the season with 58 steals, David Cone collected 16 wins and Steve Bedrosian had 22 saves.

On a more tempered note, Dave Stewart lost 21 games, no regular hit .300 and a putrid smell hung heavy in the air above Fenway Park. This pungent, odoriferous, olfactory-offensive aroma was traced directly to the power plant of the Destroyer ship. A power plant whose top homerun hitter supplied all of 18 dingers. A more feeble display has never been seen before in Fenway Park, but might be seen again in 1991 unless changes are made.

The projected starting lineup for the 1991 opening day looked as follows before the draft: C-Fisk, 1B-Milligan, 2B-Sax, 3B-Molitor, SS-Owen, LF-Cotto, CF-Finley/Yelding, RF-Baines; starting rotation: Stewart, Cone, Boyd, Hibbard and Combs; closer: Lee Smith.

In order to boost the power, the Destroyers could trade some of their excess starting pitching, or some of their fleet footed outfielders. Names rumored to be available include: P.Combs, G.Hibbard, R.Robinson, H.Baines, S.Finley, E.Yelding and even Dave Stewart.

1991 promises to be a year of transition for the Destroyers as the new ownership will try to rebuild this aging team into a perennial contender. As part of the transition, the new ownership has decided to move the franchise to Arizona for the '91 campaign. The Destroyers will also be renamed the Scottsdale Scorpions, but will continue to use Fenway Park as their home stadium.

Gulf Coast Humidity

The Gulf Coast Humidity, 1989 Champions of the American Conference, were poised for a competitive race in the 1st year of expansion in the SWBA. In the 1990 draft, GCH took rookie reliever Gregg Olson with the first of two first round draft choices. Howell was chosen with the second first rounder. Olson gave GCH tremendous 1-2 punch in the bullpen with Dennis Eckersley. Howell supplied a fine #2 man behind Dave Stewart. GCH got off to a good start at 15-11 after round 1. Dave Stewart, however, did not. After going 0 and 4 with a 6.63 ERA in 7 starts, Stew was traded along with Carlton Fisk for Don Mattingly. This gave GCH a solid first baseman in place of Danny Heep, but left a hole behind the plate. Round 2 showed this as GCH went 8-15 and slipped back in the pack. Howell, the new ace, was leading the SWBA in wins after 2 rounds with 8. GCH turned it around in round 3 going 17-ll finishing the round at 41-39 and were back in the race. They continued to play well in round 4 going 15-13 to give them a season record of 56-52. Then GCH made a move to bring one of the true young stars in baseball as well as add some pop to the batting order. GCH sent Gregg Olson and Vince Coleman to Mobile for Ruben Sierra. With this, GM Yeager may have traded away the division title. Opening round 5, GCH dropped 8 of 9 on a road trip and never seemed to recover, finishing the season at 79-83. Dwight Evans was an all-star selection in RF, hitting .272 with 19 HR, 101 runs and 111 walks. Jody Reed hit .286 with 52 doubles in a fine season. Terry Pendleton played in all 162 games and Mike Greenwell hit .285. Ken Howell finished with 15 wins and a 3.15 ERA and Eckersley had 20 saves and a 2.60 ERA as leaders of the pitching staff.

Oklahoma Switzers

The Oklahoma Switzers' inaugural SWBA season was an exciting one, but plagued by inconsistency. This was capsulized by the performance of (expected) franchise cornerstones Glenn Davis and Mark Gubicza. Davis enjoyed an MVP-type season on his way to earning all-SWBA status at first base. (.270, 49 HR 153 RBI, 101 runs, 19 GW, .550 Slug) Meanwhile, Gubicza got hammered in round one and never recovered, finishing 14-18 with a 4.39 ERA. The Switzers finished the season at 78-84, 18 games out of first place.

Season highlights included a no-hitter tossed by Jim Deshaies, Jerry Browne's 97 runs scored, Brian Harper's performance (.308, 30 doubles in 407 AB), Joe Orsulak (.310, 32 doubles, 8 triples) and Jeff Montgomery's 22 saves.

Two key in-season trades netted the Switzers two extra first round draft picks. The Switzers will look to contend in 1992 and beyond with a young nucleus of Frank Thomas, Juan Gonzalez, Ray Lankford, Steve Avery and Kevin Appier.

Pennsylvania Sluggers

Everything was looking good for the Pennsylvania Sluggers. After round 1, they had an 11-5 record on the road, had won four of their first five road series and optimism was indeed high.

But over the next five rounds, the Sluggers hit rock bottom on the road. After the strong start, the Sluggers did not win another road series until #30 and were 20-45 on the road in the next five rounds. Pennsylvania won more road series in Round 1 than in the next five rounds combined.

The result was a 77-85 record for Pennsylvania - the worst in franchise history. Ironically, the 1990 edition of the Sluggers was arguably the most talented.

Pennsylvania did manage to finish in third place in the Eastern Division (for the third consecutive year), but that was because it's collapse was matched or exceeded late in the season by several other teams.

What went wrong for the Sluggers was threefold. Almost every player on the team performed at a level below their 1989 Major League standards - of the 14 position players with at least 50 SWBA at-bats, only two had a batting average higher than their MLB average. Also, Pennsylvania's hitting was dreadful on the road after round 1 (.229 batting average). The Sluggers' performance in extra-inning games was awful regardless of where they played (4-16). Pennsylvania will take a string of six consecutive extra-inning losses into the 1991 season.

An example of the team's problems came in a 1-0, 12-inning loss to Gulf Coast when Doug Drabek tossed 9.1 innings of no-hit ball. It was the second time a PSL pitcher had a no-hitter through nine innings at GCH, but did not earn a victory. Mike Bielecki did it in 1988.

The team's biggest disappointment was the lack of hitting. The SkyDome proved to be a pitcher's haven and only compounded the problem when after round 1, many Sluggers had trouble hitting their weight on the road: Rafael Palmeiro (.230 batting average), Stan Javier (.212), Ryan Sandberg (.237) and Benito Santiago (.205).

The starting pitching was very respectful as the Sluggers received 89 quality starts. Bielecki was 14-10 with a 3.27 ERA. Sid Fernandez was 13-9 but had a 4.28 ERA and served up 30 homeruns. Doug Drabek was 11-15.

Randy Myers had his second consecutive sub-par season. He finished with a 5-11 record, 11 saves and a whopping 4.87 ERA. In round 1 road games, Myers was 2-0 with one save and a 1.08 ERA. In road games after round 1, he was 1-7 with 2 saves and an ERA of 6.75!!

Bill Landrum did step forward and take over Myers' closer role. He saved 16 games and had a 1.87 ERA.

On the brighter side, a couple of highlights were the first two triple plays in franchise history. The second of which came against Kodiak and ended the game.

Howard Johnson was the team's Most Valuable Player. He hit .264 with 46 doubles, 28 homeruns, 95 RBI, 105 runs scored and 61 stolen bases.

Philadelphia Mob

The Mob approached the expansion draft with the goal of drafting power, pitching and defense. The Mob ended up with four solid starters, a great closer and plenty of power. Defense was chosen in Clark, Frank White, Jose Uribe, Ken Caminiti and Cory Snyder. Bob Geren was picked to handle the duties behind the plate with his rocket arm. Gerald Young was acquired to catch everything hit into CF and more defense was added later when Andy Van Slyke was picked up in a trade.

Everything went well early in the season for the Mob, the starters were going into the later innings, setting things up for Jeff Russell and the power was gaining the Mob the leads to hold. But, over the long haul, the Mob never had the on-base percentage to compete. They hit far too many solo homeruns - nobody to get on base when we needed a runner to set up the power guys. With Will Clark struggling in the average and on-base categories, the Mob had to hope to win a lot of 3-2 games. When the starters did begin to tire, there was just no middle relief to quiet a rally or keep the score down.

Yount was the MVP, posting a .310 mark with 36 doubles, 9 triples, 103 runs and 30 steals. Greg Jefferies turned in a solid season, his first as a full time player. He hit .259 with 30 doubles and 11 dingers, scoring 71 runs and swiping 35 bases. In addition to Straw's bad year, Jack Clark, Juan Samuel, Mike Pagliarulo and Mike Gallego were each depended on to help the club, they responded with batting averages around .200.

The Tides were still in the thick of things at the season's mid-point. They posted a 40-41 record early, but the second half opened with a slide of 2-11 setting up a long season. The longest JST win streak was 6 games, the longest losing streak was 7 coming in that 2-11 stretch.

California Coolers

The 1990 California Coolers suffered through their first ever losing season. This was to be expected as the team had many holes to fill and figured to be in a 2-3 year overhaul to regain their winning form of the previous two years.

The Coolers played surprisingly well at home, winning 44 games, but were in a funk when it came to playing outside of Wrigley. The Coolers could win only 5 series on the road all year, and lost 18 of 26 road games to start the year.

Directly responsible for the decline in California performance was the pitching staff. Horrible starting pitching combined with a disappointing bullpen, spelled disaster and a record team ERA of 4.44, astronomical by previous Cooler standards. Cooler management used 10 different starters, but only Rick Aguilera and Scotty Sanderson proved to be consistent. Aguilera was the Ace, going 16-7 with a 3.31 ERA. Sanderson also was a double digit winner, posting a 10-8 record and a 3.89 ERA. Doug Jones, although roughed up on occasion, managed to save 29 games, giving him 62 the last two years. Todd Burns was the stud of the pen, with a line of 5-2, 11 saves and 2.14 ERA.

Offensively, the Coolers were led by Tony Fernandez and Rookie of the Year, Dwight Smith. Fernandez led the team in hits for the 3rd consecutive season with 180, scored 85 runs, stole 50 bases and had 40 extra-base hits. Smith batted .322, scored 64 runs and had 36 extra-base hits in 370 atbats. Big Mark McGwire led the team in the long ball department with 36 and Jose Canseco chipped in with 21 in only 236 at-bats.

Next year will continue to be a rebuilding year as management will look to draft and trade for starting pitching, and some young talent at the infield positions, centerfield and catcher.

Meadville Grays

1990 was a very long year for the Grays. While they harbored no visions of making the playoffs, they certainly did not expect to win just 65 games. The main culprit? Lack of punch. In 1989, Meadville scored 670 runs while winning 79 games. In 1990, they could score only 535 runs, nearly one run per game less than the previous year.

Virtually everyone "contributed". Rickey Henderson fell from .284 and 109 runs scored in 1989 to .236 and 81 in 1990. Barry Larkin, playing only part-time in 1990 drove in just 31 runs as compared to 91 the year before. As a team, the batting average fell from .249 to .229. Even Joe Carter, who smacked 41 homeruns this year, saw his RBI total fall from 124 to 102 because so many of his clouts came with the bases empty.

The pitching staff performed about the same as in 1989. Team ERA actually fell from 3.62 to 3.54. However, the lack of run support created a condition where no regular starter had a winning record. Greg Swindell was the best at 10-11. The bullpen also suffered occasionally from the lack of a true stopper. The Grays are definitely not in favor of the committee approach to bullpen management.

What are the prospects for 1991? Management is making no predictions, preferring to let the players (hopefully) do the talking.

Surprisingly, that first win went to Derek Lilliquist, as did the second win. Lilliquist's good early performance as the #5 man in the starting rotation was an indication that the other young starters would not live up to expectations.

The biggest disappointment of the young guns had to be Allan Anderson. The lefty had trouble even getting to the third inning. When he did pitch well, there was no offensive support. This led him to a poor 4-14 record.

Overall, the starting staff did please management, sighting poor offense as the main contributor of the loss column. Scott Garrelts' low ERA of 2.66 and mediocre record of 13-12 was a prime example of this. Because Garrelts was the only starter that could go the full nine innings (he did this 9 times, throwing 4 shutouts) the bullpen always had someone up throwing. Having to use Brantley early-on, so many times, it was Williamson who became the set-up man in 61 appearances. There was some question on who the stopper would be early in the season. But, as the schedule wore on, it was evident Manager Michurski was fed up with the tators Reardon was serving up. So the "wild thing" would become the stopper. Having Williams post a 9-10 record with 16 saves indicated how many close games were won or lost in the ninth.

Offensively, the whole team was disappointing. Everyone's average was not what was expected. Al Newman was the over-achiever, leading the team with a .267 average. Newman also compiled 43 stolen bases which tied Willie Wilson for the team lead.

The team was built around power and defense. Both were evident as the Hens pounded out 146 long balls and committed only 102 errors.

Kent "buy a vowel" Hrbek carried the team early, hitting a total of 26 dingers with limited play. Kevin Mitchell became the franchise, as he said good bye to Mr. Spaulding 52 times and pushed 139 players across the plate.

The consensus of the coming year is the ownership would like to improve at three positions. A full-time catcher, outfielder and starting pitching are the priorities.
