

GREENSBORO HORNETS VS. WAGRAM WARHAWKS

Game 1

Greensboro 002 000 000 - 2 7 0 W-Candiotti L-Moore S-Schooler

Wagram 000 000 000 - 0 2 1 HR-none

The Greensboro Hornets limped into the post season without the help of John Kruk, Glenallen Hill and a few other players. The pitching staff was healthy and that counted for a lot. This game was a duel between these pitching rich teams. The Hornets threatened early, loading the bases in the top of the second. Mike Moore then struck out John Wehner and got Tom Candiotti to hit into a 6-4-3 doubleplay to end the inning. In the third, Ozzie Guillen drilled a one out triple and scored 5 pitches later on Rick Wilkins passed ball. B.J. Surhoff singled in Tony Gwynn who had walked and taken second on the PB. The Warhawks threatened in the bottom half, loading the bases with a single, walk and hit batsman. Candiotti then forced a foul pop out and two short fly balls to end the inning. Both pitchers settled in and nothing really happened until the bottom of the 9th. Candiotti issued two 2-out walks to load the bases and manager Larry Taube reached for the bullpen phone. Mike Schooler came in to fan Jeff Schaefer and record the save. Tony Gwynn was 2-2 with 3 walks in the game.

Game 2

Greensboro 000 000 010 - 1 4 1 W-Clemens L-G.W.Harris Wagram 000 011 00x - 2 10 0 HR-Wehner, Palmeiro

The Warhawks Manager Scott Firman called on his ace Roger Clemens to go in game two. Roger was over-powering. He never allowed more than one baserunner in any inning en route to a 4 hitter. John Wehner's HR in the 8th was the only ball hit with any authority. Offensively, Luis Polonia went 3-4 with 2 doubles from the lead off spot and Rafael Palmeiro was 2-4 with a double and homerun batting third. The Hornet's Greg W. Harris took the loss, but gave up only 1 run in 5 IP.

Game 3

Wagram 301 000 000 - 4 6 2 W-G.A.Harris L-Erickson S-Andersen Greensboro 000 010 002 - 3 11 2 HR-none

Luis Polonia led off the game with a single. Chuck Knoblauch hit a slow roller to 3rd that John Wehner couldn't find the handle on. Palmeiro stepped to the plate and drilled a screaming line drive into right-center and motored to third with a 2-rbi triple. Raffy then scored on Mel Hall's fly ball to LF. The 'hawks added another run in the 3rd when Dave Henderson drove a 2-out Scott Erickson pitch into CF. Greg A. Harris cruised through 7 innings scattering 7 hits and allowing only 1 unearned run. Dave Righetti held the Hornets in the 8th, but with Mark Eichorn on the hill, the bottom of the 9th got exciting. Chito Martinez singled, Dickie Thon misplayed Mike Felder's double play ball, then Omar Vizquel singled to load the bases. Roberto Alomar ripped a one out Eichorn offering for a 2-rbi single. With runners on 1st and 3rd, Larry Andersen strolled in from the bullpen. He got Mike

Brumley to hit into a force play and Tony Gwynn to fly out to LF. Palmeiro got 3 of the Warhawks' 6 hits and Chito Martinez was 4-4 for the Hornets.

Game 4

Wagram 010 100 006 - 8 11 1 W-B.Smith L-Moore Greensboro 152 002 60x - 16 22 0 HR-D.Henderson

The Hornets were stirred up after out-hitting Wagram 11-6 in game 3 and coming out on the losing end. They made no mistakes in this one. They hammered Mike Moore for 6 earned runs in 1.2 innings. Mike Portugal and Bruce Hurst were not effective either giving up 4 more runs in their 3.2 innings of relief. Greensboro didn't show any mercy on the mop up crew either, tallying 6 more in the 7th to make it 16-2. The Warhawks finally got to Bryn Smith for 6 runs in the 9th, but it was too little, too late. B.J. Surhoff led the charge with a 4-5, 4 rbi day. Alomar, Guillen and Martinez had 3 hits apiece as every starter, including Bryn Smith, had 2 hits or more except for Ronnie Gant.

Game 5

Wagram 000 001 000 - 1 4 0 W-Schooler L-Clemens S-Charlton Greensboro 000 010 03x - 4 7 0 HR-Ch.Martinez

Roger Clemens was called on to do his magic again. This time he was up against Tom Candiotti. The two aces locked heads and lived up to their billing. Candiotti pitched 6 strong innings before being pinch hit for. He allowed 2 hits and fanned 7 batters. Clemens was just as impressive through the first 7 innings as the teams battled to a 1-1 tie. In the bottom of the 8th, the bottom fell out for Rah-jah. Omar Vizquel drew a 2-out walk, Robby Alomar singled, Ozzie Guillen then singled in Vizquel. Manager Firman went to the mound, but Clemens convinced him that he could get the last out. Tony Gwynn ripped the very next pitch down the RF line for a 2-rbi triple. Norm Charlton came in to set down the 'hawks in order in the 9th for the save.

Game 6

Greensboro 300 000 000 - 3 6 0 W-G.W.Harris L-G.A.Harris Wagram 100 000 000 - 1 8 0 S-Charlton HR-none

The Warhawks were confident they could win the last two home games to advance to the World Series. After all, they were 9-1 against the Hornets during the regular season. Game 6 was staged as the battle of the Greg Harris'. GW was set for the visitors, GA for the home squad. The Hornets scored all they needed in the top of the first. Guillen singled with one out, Gwynn walked, Eddie Murray singled in Guillen and Gwynn advanced to third on Surhoff's fly to right. Chito Martinez doubled home Gwynn and Murray. Mike Felder then ripped a shot to right, Mel Hall scooped it up, hit Chuck Knoblauch with a bullet and then Chuck whirled and fired it to Rick Wilkins to nail Martinez at the plate and In the bottom half, Knoblauch singled, stole second and end the inning. scored on Palmeiro's single. Greg A. settled down and he and Dave Righetti downed 20 of the last 21 batters they faced, but the damage had been done. Greg W. scattered 6 hits and fanned 5 in his 7.1 innings before yielding to Norm Charlton. The Hornets had advanced to their

first World Series. Chito Martinez was 10-20 with 4 doubles, 1 HR, 5 runs and 4 rbi to get named American Conference Championship Series MVP. Rafael Palmeiro turned in a brilliant performance with 11-22, 3 doubles, 2 triples, a HR and 7 rbi for Wagram. Even without John Kruk's presence in the lineup, the Hornets managed a .278 average to the Warhawks' .211.

DESERT DIAMONDS VS. ARIZONA APACHES

Game 1

Diamonds 000 010 010 - 2 8 1 W-Morris L-Franco S-Leiter

Apaches 001 000 000 - 1 4 0 HR-none

The first ever playoff series played head to head saw Pat Mitchell's Arizona Apaches take on Kevin Mattingly's Desert Diamonds. The two connected using PC Anywhere and played via modem. The staff aces squared off in game one: Jack Morris for Desert, Greg Maddux for Arizona. The Apaches tallied first when a Jody Reed error loaded the bases in the bottom of the 3rd. Luis Gonzalez lifted a towering fly to CF and Greg Maddux trotted home. In the top of the 5th, Maddux allowed a bases loaded, 2-out walk to tie the game. In the bottom of the 5th, Brett Butler singled, stole second and third, but was nailed at the plate by Don Mattingly's throw on Lenny Harris' squeeze bunt attempt. With John Franco on the hill in the top of the 9th, Willie McGee doubled. He advanced to third on Mattingly's groundout into the hole at 2B. Franco then threw one in the dirt that Mickey Tettleton couldn't handle and McGee raced home. Morris allowed only 4 hits in 8 innings and Mark Leiter sat the Apaches down in order in the 9th.

Game 2

Diamonds 000 200 002 02 - 6 14 2 W-D.Robinson L-Howe S-Leiter Apaches 200 200 000 00 - 4 10 2 HR-Sierra, Grace, L.Gonzalez

The Apaches jumped on Bill Gullickson early. Butler singled in the bottom of the first and one out later, Mark Grace hit a line drive over the RF fence for a 2-0 lead. Four singles and a sacrifice fly in the top of the 4th tied it for the Diamonds. Luis Gonzalez homered to lead off the bottom of the 4th, and Butler drove in Steve Buechele who tripled after Gonzalez' dinger. Pat Mitchell called on his highly regarded bullpen to save this one. It looked like this one was in the bag for the Apaches. Tom Henke fanned the first two batters he faced in He then walked Terry Pendleton and Ruben Sierra drilled a Henke fastball over the wall to force extra innings. In the top of the 11th, with Steve Howe on the mound, Dwight Evans singled but was cut down going to third on Lenny Harris' relay of Greg Vaughn's throw. With two outs, Howe hurt himself as he mishandled Pendleton's bouncer. Sierra shined again ripping a 2-rbi double to put the Diamonds up 2 games to none.

Game 3

Apaches 210 003 000 - 6 13 0 W-K.Hill L-Rasmussen

Diamonds 000 000 000 - 0 7 0 HR-Duncan

The Apaches got just what they needed in game 3. Ken Hill took the mound and before he was finished pitching had tossed a 6-0, 7-hitter. Manager Mitchell was sooooo. glad he didn't have to go to the pen. The top of the order provided the offense for Arizona. Butler was 3-5 with a pair of runs. Mariano Duncan went 2-5 with a homer and 2 rbi. Steve Buechele was 2-4 with 2 rbi. Hill got in on the action as well with 1 hit in 4 trips with a run and rbi. Dennis Rasmussen took the loss.

Game 4

Apaches 000 000 520 - 7 9 0 W-Franco L-Leiter S-Terry

Diamonds 310 010 000 - 5 9 0 HR-Pendleton

The Apaches looked to Greg Maddux to tie it up. Their ace starter got roughed up though and lasted only 2 innings. He walked 2, gave up 5 hits and 4 runs. Terry Pendleton's 3-run homer in the bottom of the first was the big blast. As he did in his first outing, Maddux walked in a run in the 2nd inning and was subsequently removed for a pinch-hitter. Rookie sensation Juan Guzman cruised into the 7th inning tossing a one-hitter. After a walk and single, Mattingly removed Guzman in favor of Bruce Ruffin. Ruffin gave up four straight hits and when the smoke had cleared, the score was knotted at five. In the top of the 8th, Arizona went ahead on a 2-out single by Buechele and added some insurance with Duncan's rbi double. The bullpen was fresh this time as John Franco and Scott Terry sat down 9 of the 10 batters they faced. The Apaches' relief corps sat down 14 of the last 15 in the game.

Game 5

Apaches 100 000 000 - 1 7 1 W-Morris L-Tewksbury

Diamonds 004 100 11x - 7 12 0 HR-none

Just as the Apaches were to sigh a little relief, they ran in to Jack Morris again. Jack continued his mastery of the Apache hitters. He cruised through 8 innings allowing only 6 hits and one run. In the bottom of the 3rd, Jody Reed led off with a single. Manny Lee then singled him to 3B. Morris then helped his own cause ripping a double into the gap to score both runners. Alfredo Griffin then threw away an easy grounder that let Morris score and McGee reach 2B. Terry Pendleton capped off the scoring with an rbi single to plate Willie. Jack Morris was 2-3 with 3 rbi at the plate. Terry Pendleton, Lee and Reed also had two hits each for the Diamonds.

Game 6

Diamonds 003 000 000 - 3 7 1 W-Terry L-Gullickson S-Do.Henry Apaches 000 023 00x - 5 12 0 HR-L.Gonzalez

The Apaches were glad to be back home. With Greg Maddux's short outing in game 4, plus the day off before game 6, Mitchell decided it was "do or die" time and if Greg could go, he would. Greg agreed. But, as they had done in his previous two outings, the Diamonds had his number. Manny Lee singled and one out later, Don Mattingly walked. Terry

Pendleton hit a 2-out rbi double to score Lee. Ruben Sierra then plated both Mattingly and Pendleton with a single. The Apache fans became very quiet and uneasy. They had won it all in 1989 as the Tempe Tigers and they wanted to taste the World Series again. Bill Gullickson was pitching well. He allowed only one baserunner per inning until the Steve Buechele double and went to 3B on Griffin's bottom of the 5th. Pat Tabler pinch hit for Maddux and singled home sacrifice bunt. Tabler sneaked off and stole second then scored on Butler's Buechele. Suddenly, the crowd was alive, there was hope... rbi single. bottom of the 6th, with 2 outs, Luis Gonzalez drilled a homerun over the Gullickson then walked Buechele and Griffin doubled. Timlin trotted in from the Diamond pen. Lenny Harris greeted him with a 2 rbi single and the Apaches were up 5-3. The Apaches' pen rose to the occasion as Terry, Howe and Doug Henry combined to allow only one baserunner in the last 4 innings.

Game 7

Diamonds 000 002 000 - 2 5 2 W-K.Hill L-Ju.Guzman S-Henke Apaches 100 200 10x - 4 7 1 HR-Greenwell, Tettleton

The Apaches had forced a seventh game. The Oakland Coliseum was sold Ken Hill against Juan Guzman. Both pitchers were dominant in their previous outings. In the bottom of the 1st, Lenny Harris stole 2B and went to 3B on Jeff Reed's throwing error. Mark Grace then lifted a The crowd went wild. deep fly to RF to sacrifice Harris in. bottom of the 4th, Gonzalez doubled and scored on Mickey Tettleton's The Apaches led 3-0. In the top of the 6th, Mike Greenwell got all of a Ken Hill pitch and rocketed into the RF bleachers for a 2-out, 2-run homer. Mitchell's confidence was back for his relievers. Franco, Howe, Henry and Terry held the game in check for Tom Henke. opened the 9th with Joey Cora's groundout. Cecil Espy then walked, then Alfredo Griffin fumbled a sure doubleplay ball. The crowd got silent, many closed their eyes. Henke blew off a little steam, re-grouped and got Willie McGee to hit into a 4-6-3 game ending doubleplay. Apaches were in the Series. Ken Hill was named the National Conference Championship MVP. He was 2-0 with a 1.17 ERA, 8 K's and only 10 hits in 15.1 clutch innings.

Game 1

Apaches 000 000 003 - 3 9 1 W-Schooler L-Do.Henry

Hornets 100 000 111 - 4 9 2 HR-none

Counting the championship series, the Apaches were 97-72 and the Hornets were 99-69. Greg Maddux was hoping to rebound from his disappointment. Tom Candiotti wanted to continue his post-season accolades. The Hornets scored in the bottom of the 1st when Eddie Murray singled home Roberto Alomar. Both starters cruised through the 6th inning and it was 1-0

when Chito Martinez singled off Steve Howe, advanced to 2B on a sac bunt, went to 3B on a passed ball and scored on Mike Felder's single. The Hornets took a 3-0 lead in the bottom of the 8th when Jim Clancy yielded 3 singles and threw a wild pitch. With one out in the 9th, Candiotti wore down and headed for the showers. With one on and one out, Norm Charlton gave up a single to Greg Vaughn and rbi single to Steve Buechele. Vaughn then scored on Mike Schooler's wild pitch. Ozzie Guillen then booted Alfredo Griffin's bouncer, setting up Skeeter Barnes' sacrifice fly to tie the game. Griffin returned the favor for the Hornets. He threw away Mike Felder's easy grounder, allowing Felder to score on the next pitch, a game-winning pinch-hit single by Ronnie Gant.

Game 2

Apaches 000 000 010 - 1 5 0 W-G.W.Harris L-Tewksbury S-Schooler Hornets 200 000 01x - 3 10 0 HR-none

The Hornets jumped out early again in game 2. Roberto Alomar started the bottom of the 1st with a double, Guillen then singled home Robby and Gwynn doubled him home. Greg Harris was on. He pitched 7 innings of 2-hit shutout ball. In the top of the 8th, a hit batter and two singles led to the Apaches lone run. A pair of doubles gave the Hornets some insurance in the bottom half. For the game, Tony Gwynn was 3-4 with 2 doubles to lead all hitters.

Game 3

Hornets 000 000 000 - 0 4 0 W-K.Hill L-Erickson S-Henke Apaches 100 002 00x - 3 4 2 HR-none

Ken Hill continued his post-season mastery. He went 6.2 innings, fanning 5 hitters and allowing only 4 hits before yielding to the pen. In the bottom of the 1st, Brett Butler walked and went to 2B on Lenny Harris' sacrifice. Luis Gonzalez ripped a 2-out double to plate Butler and give Hill all the runs he needed. In the bottom of the 6th, Greg Vaughn hit a 2-out, 2-rbi double to give the Apaches some insurance. The Apache bullpen allowed only one walk over the last 2.1 innings to seal the victory. Gonzalez was 2-4 with 2 doubles to lead all hitters.

Game 4

Hornets 000 101 000 - 2 10 1 W-Maddux L-B.Smith S-Howe Apaches 030 000 00x - 3 4 1 HR-none

Greg Maddux scattered 9 hits over 6.1 innings en route to his first victory of the '92 post-season. The Hornets out hit the Apaches 10-4, but never rattled Maddux. Arizona tallied 3 runs in the 2nd when Gonzalez walked and scored on Tettleton's double. Tettleton scored on Ozzie Guillen's boot, Vaughn subsequently scored on a fielder's choice. The bullpen came on to pitch 2.2 innings of scoreless relief to tie the series at two games.

Game 5

Hornets 300 101 000 - 5 8 1 W-Candiotti L-Whitehurst Apaches 000 100 000 - 1 3 2 HR-Ch.Martinez, Gant

The Hornets jumped all over Wally Whitehurst in the 1st inning. A single, error and 3-run shot by Chito Martinez gave Tom Candiotti all the padding he needed. Tom completed a 3-hitter, fanning 4 with no earned runs. Arizona got singles in the 3rd, 4th and 5th innings, then Candiotti sat down the last 13 in order to win it. Roberto Alomar had a pair of hits for the Hornets. The Hornets were going back home with a 3-2 advantage.

Game 6

Apaches 000 010 011 - 3 8 1 W-Tewksbury L-G.W.Harris S-Henke Hornets 001 000 000 - 1 3 0 HR-G.Vaughn

Bob Tewksbury redeemed himself in this one. He tossed 7 innings of 3 hit ball before yielding to Doug Henry and Tom Henke. The Hornets tallied first though. Ozzie Guillen smashed a single to right center that plated Mike Felder. Ozzie pulled a hamstring running to first though and would be out the rest of the series. The Apaches tied it in the 5th when Steve Buechele stroked a 2-out double and scored on Alfredo Griffin's single. In the top of the 8th, after a double to Brett Butler and walk to Lenny Harris, a passed ball by B.J. Surhoff allowed Butler to trot home on Mark Grace's sacrifice fly. Greg Vaughn gave the Apache bullpen another run in the 9th with a solo shot to LF. Henry and Henke sat down the last 6 men in order to save the game and force game 7.

Game 7

Apaches 510 010 001 - 8 13 0 W-K.Hill L-Erickson S-Howe Hornets 003 000 210 - 6 11 0 HR-none

The Apaches chased Scott Erickson after 2/3 of an inning. off with a single and went to 2B on Harris' sacrifice. Grace's single drove in Butler. Gonzalez hit into a force play for the second out. Mickey Tettleton then walked and Greg Vaughn and Steve Buechele hit back-to-back triples for a 4-0 lead. Bud Black relieved Erickson and Alfredo Griffin greeted him with a single to score Buechele. bottom of the 3rd, Mike Felder singled, Alomar singled and Omar Vizquel walked to load the bases. Maddux then threw one down the middle and Tony Gwynn lined it into the gap for a 3-rbi double. Mitchell pulled Maddux and brought in post-season phenom Ken Hill. Hill quickly put out Griffin swung the big bat again in the 5th, driving in Greg Vaughn with a 2-out double. Hill pitched 3 innings of 1-hit, shutout ball and wound up the winner. The game wasn't over yet though. John Franco on the hill in the bottom of the 7th, Greensboro got a wild pitch and 3 singles to make it a 7-5 game. They got to Scott Terry in the bottom of the 8th as Alomar doubled home Ronnie Gant to pull within In the 9th, Luis Gonzalez singled home Brett Butler with some insurance for the Apache pen. With Doug Henry and Franco already out of the game and Tom Henke with a sore arm, Pat Mitchell gave Steve Howe the nod for the 9th. A lead off triple by Tony Gwynn made Mitchell uneasy and the Hornet crowd cautiously happy. Gwynn held at 3B on Eddie Murray's grounder to short. The Hornets had Norm Charlton due up, but he had to bat as the bench was empty. Howe fanned Charlton and Surhoff to end the game. The Arizona Apaches and Pat Mitchell become the first team to win the World Series twice in the 5 year history of the SWBA. Ken Hill (2-0, 5 H, 0 R, 9.2 IP) was named World Series MVP.

WAGRAM WARHAWKS

The 1992 Warhawks improved 16 games over their last season record by winning 95 games and taking the Kaline Division title. This was Wagram's second division championship in the last three seasons. The 1992 turnabout was accomplished through pitching with the team ERA dropping from 3.73 last year to a very solid 3.27 in 1992. The team batting average actually decreased from .267 in 1991 to .256 in 1992. The lack of average was offset by a huge increase in team speed, which set a Wagram record with 186 stolen bases.

The offense was lead by Dave Henderson who had a somewhat surprising season. Hendu hit a very respectable .285 while slamming 32 home runs and 85 RBIs. Once again Mell Hall had strong season hitting .277 with 22 home runs 105 ribbies and did all that in just over 500 at bats. Chuck Knoblauch hit a disappointing .245 but broke a team record by stealing 70 bases. He also anchored the infield by playing a very good second base. Rafael Palmeiro and Don Slaught came over in mid-season trades and contributed down the pennant stretch. They hit .322 and .345 respectively with Palmeiro driving in 37 runs in just 53 games. Luis Polonia once again provided the spark by hitting .304 in the lead off spot and stole 57 bases.

The team MVP was no doubt Roger Clemens. The Rocket went 20-11 with a 1.91 ERA and would have won more games if he had gotten any support. He also pitched seven shutouts. Mike Moore regained his form after a disappointing 1991. Moore bounced back to win 18 games while only losing nine, and posted a 2.43 ERA. The starting rotation was rounded out by Greg A. Harris (12-7, 3.26), Bruce Hurst (10-12, 4.12) and Mark Portugal (9-9, 4.69). Mark Eichhorn was the main closer saving 18 games with an ERA of 1.41, but Dave Righetti contributed 13 saves and a 2.59 mark himself. Only three Warhawk pitchers, who pitched significant innings, compiled over a 3.50 ERA.

The Warhawks acquired the above mentioned Palmeiro and Slaught, as well as Eric Anthony, Tracy Jones, Randy Milligan, Larry Andersen and Jim DeShaies during the season. They also said goodbye to Todd Benzinger, Mike Bordick, Danny Cox, Curt Schilling, Joel Skinner, Daryl Boston and Vincente Palacios. The acquired players helped lift the Wagram team into the playoffs.

The Warhawks are looking forward to the 1993 season and have a projected lineup of: 1b-Palmeiro, 2b-Knoblauch, ss-Fletcher/Thon, 3b-Seitzer, c-Girardi/Slaught with an outfield consisting of Polonia, Burks, Coleman, Burnansky and Ricky Jordan. The starting rotation appears to include Clemens, Moore, Hurst, Pichardo, Portugal and DeShaies. Middle relief appears to be very strong with Andersen, Wickander, Boever, Edens, Shifflett and Righetti. Greg A. Harris is slated to be the closer.

With any luck the Warhawks hope to once again reach the playoffs and finally get over the final hurdle. They thought they had a good shot last year against Greensboro after beating the Hornets nine of 10 during the regular season, but lost in the playoffs four games to two. Well, as they say, there's always next year.

GREENSBORO HORNETS

The Greensboro Hornets battled the San Francisco Seals all year for first place in the Kaline Division, but managed to win by nine games down the stretch. Their 95-67 finish gives the West Coast/Chicago/Greensboro franchise an all-time .570 winning percentage. Even so, this franchise's first trip to the World Series was this year and they came up short.

Pitching was the forte of the Hornets. The team ERA was 3.21 with three starters below 3.00 and the other two below 3.50. Tom Candiotti was 14-10 with a 2.70 ERA. He completed 7 games with 4 shutouts and allowed only 7.13 hits per 9 innings. Just behind him with a 2.93 ERA was Scott Erickson. Scott finished with a 15-10 record, tossing 3 shutouts. Bryn Smith compiled a 14-6 record with a 3.47 ERA. Bud Black finished with a 3.49 ERA and 9 wins. Greg W. Harris was the biggest surprise. He was 12-7 in 19 starts, allowing only 5.17 hits per 9 innings for a spectacular 1.70 ERA. He held the opponents scoreless in all 4 games he completed.

Offensively, the Hornets stung opponent pitching with 5 regulars over .290. Tony Gwynn led the way, hitting .339 on the season with 29 doubles and 16 triples. B.J. Surhoff hit a very solid .320 in 448 plate appearances. John Kruk put together a fabulous season. He hit .307, stroked 29 doubles, 7 triples and 22 homers, and scored 88 runs while driving in 89. By the end of the season though, Kruk was totally fatigued and unable to play in the post season. This was a crucial event that may have cost the Hornets their first championship. Roberto Alomar really showcased his talents, moving himself towards becoming the SWBA's best second baseman. All he did was hit .291, belt 42 doubles and 15 triples, score 102 runs and steal 60 bases. In the field he was nearly flawless with only 5 errors.

The future is still bright for this perennial power. This team has a good blend of youth and player who are in their prime. Look for the Greensboro Hornets to contend for quite some time.

ARIZONA APACHES

The 1992 Arizona Apaches can be summed up in three simple words pitching, pitching, pitching. This, however, is not too surprising if you consider that this is the same front office that made Tom Henke the number two overall pick in the first ever SWBA draft. The makeup of this club has always centered around the mound. It was in that same draft that the Apaches also acquired with the 25th round pick, a skinny kid with an ERA over five and he pitched in hitter-friendly Wrigley Field. That was over 75 SWBA wins ago, and this year's MVP is Greg Maddux.... Maddux started 40 games for the Apaches and ended with a 17-10 win loss record and 2.55 ERA in 282.0 innings pitched with seven complete games and three shutouts...

The next two starters also benefitted from throwing home games at the pitcher friendly confines of Oakland County Coliseum. Both Bob Tewksbury and Ken Hill turned in solid seasons. Tewks! for the second consecutive season posted 13 wins and his losses increased from only two in 1991 to eight this year with a 3.36 ERA, three complete games and one shutout... Ken Hill had an up and down year, however, he finished as strong as any pitcher in the SWBA down the stretch. Hill on the year ended at 15-10 but at the 2/3rd mark of the season was only 9-10. Hill then went on a 10-0 run including four wins in two post season playoff series. Hill was named World Series MVP...Perhaps the biggest surprise of the season was Wally Whitehurst. As the fifth starter and long relief man for the Apaches, Whitehurst went 12-5 with a 2.87 ERA in 15 starts.

Due to a wealth of talent in the Apache bullpen, no one pitcher posted overwhelming numbers but as a unit they proved to be most effective. Tom Henke notched his 100th SWBA save for the franchise this season, en route to 25 saves a 3-4 record and 1.89 ERA Doug Henry and John Franco both combined for an additional 14 saves and Henry's 1.33 ERA was a team low. Setups handled by the trio of Jim Clancy, Scott Terry and Steve Howe and of the three Terry had the most impressive season going 8-2 with two saves and a 2.79 ERA. As for the many off field problems of Steve Howe, the Apache front office has advised that Steve will provide community service seminars at Chaparral High School entitled "How to Break the Law and Not Go To Jail. And in an Al Davis type environment CEO-GM-MANAGER Pat Mitchell commented "I only care who he WHIFFS and not whatever he SNIFFS". Mr Howe's parole officer will travel with the team next season.

At the plate the Apaches were again led in most offensive categories by Brett Butler, who is the key that turns on the Apache offense. However, the biggest change in the '92 Apache offensive attack has been power. After hitting only 61 home runs as a team in 1991, the '92 Apaches doubled that number to 122 team home runs. It was without a doubt the most significant reason for the resurgence of this franchise. Butler's production reads as follows: 161 games, 625 AB, 198 hits with 106 runs scored, all team highs. Butler also hit for a .298 average with 44 RBIs hitting from the lead off spot exclusively.

Pedro Munoz won his second straight team batting title with a .304 average in 138 at bats. Mickey Tettleton led the Apaches in two power categories home runs 27 and also RBIs with 95, but hit a disappointing .230. First round draft pick Luis Gonzales did not disappoint, as he lead the club in both doubles (33) and triples (10), hit a very solid .272 and was deserving of his Rookie of the Year honors. Lenny Harris stole 38 bases, hit .295 and played consistently in the field at second base. Steve Buechele and Greg Vaughn helped with the power surge by hitting 21 homers each and Buechele was outstanding defensively at third base.

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CAPE CRUSADERS

The 1992 SWBA season ended on a slightly disappointing note for the Crusaders as several key players stumbled down the stretch. This fact, along with Wagram's strong finish dashed any hopes of a Crusader pennant after one of the more exciting divisional races in the SWBA this season.

As a team, the Crusaders did not execute very well in the clutch. The really big hits came when they were needed least and the team hit only .237. The Crusaders were too stocked with right-handed hitters and as a result, their opponents capitalized on an obvious vulnerability to right-handed pitching. The 1993 Crusaders will be in the market for some left-handed bats in the off-season to provide a more balanced attack. On the bright side, this team did provide some power as five of its starting nine had at least 16 homeruns. The offensive star for 1992 would have to be Joe Carter for his consistent production and his team leading 36 homers. The offensive disappointment would be Chris Sabo as he led the Crusaders in under-achievement, hitting only .254 with 17 homers. The Crusaders did, however, have five players with 30 or more stolen bases. Leading the way was Rickey Henderson with 72.

The 1992 Crusaders were blessed with some quality arms in their starting rotation (well, at least the top 4). I suppose it can be said that starting pitching was the main team strength, as it usually kept opponents bats relatively quiet while the Crusader offense struggled to put a few runs on the board. Jose Rijo was the mainstay of the Crusader staff as he led the team with a 2.12 ERA and 179 strikeouts in 207.2 innings, along with impeccable control. Jack McDowell led the team in victories with 17, strikeouts with 179, innings pitched with 252.1, and put up a more than respectable 2.85 ERA. Jimmy Key and Greg Swindell both pitched some great games. However, Swindell was prone to in-consistency and the homerun ball, allowing 25. Control was the trademark of a staff with no one real dominant force, with only one man posting more than 14 victories. At least opponents generally had to earn their own way on base as the staff allowed only 2.5 walks/9 inn. The number five man in the rotation was filled with the likes of Mike Gardiner, Ben McDonald, Dave Steib, and Kent Mercker. No one in this group really impressed and could have been a main reason why the Crusaders faded down the stretch. Beware in 1993 as the Crusader starters will be even more impressive with the addition of Arthur Rhodes. Unfortunately, my starters could not complete every start, and here was what I consider my most damaging shortcoming. Middle relief corps for the Crusaders consisted of ineffective arms Dennis Lamp and Eric Plunk (ERA'S 4.78 and 6.29 respectively). Only Kent Mercker was able to demonstrate any consistency with a 2.66 ERA in 74 innings. The role of closer was shared early on between Bob Thigpen and Stan Belinda. Thigpen was banished to a somewhat less crucial role after proving himself unworthy of the stopper job. Belinda was truly the man for the job, as he was called upon to save 39 ball games. The only knock on him was he tended to walk too many and occasionally allow the most inopportune homer.

MESA MUSTANGS

The Mesa Mustangs strategy prior to the opening of the 1992 season was to collect some big bats to make things happen. Dave Kruper thoroughly examined the SWBA and saw the success the Kodiak Aces had putting an explosive team on the field with mediocre pitching. Devon White and Chili Davis fit the mold Kruper was looking for and they were added in the draft.

The team started out surprisingly well, but manager Kruper was forced out of the league due to time constraints and Steve Scott took over at the helm. The Mustangs were locked in a three way battle for the Clemente division crown all year with the Arizona Apaches and Arrows. When the dust settled, the Mustangs' lack of starting pitching found them in second place.

Offensively, there were some great performances. Ozzie Smith scored 118 runs, stole 82 bases and collected 193 hits for a .312 average. He also took 94 free passes for a .403 on-base percentage. Harold Baines belted 28 dingers and drove in 101 runs. Devon White scored 11 times making himself and the Wizard a deadly one-two punch. White also had 32 doubles, 13 triples, 14 homers and 59 steals. Chili Davis ripped 43 doubles, 23 homeruns and drove in 114. He hit .258, but walked 83 times for a .352 on-base. His slugging percentage was .454 to lead the regulars.

On the mound, the Mustangs had a great relief crew. Rick Aguilera saved 30 ballgames, with a 2.09 ERA and a 7-6 record. Mike Maddux and John Habyan combined for a 21-10 record as set up men. Maddux sported a 2.77 ERA in 85 games and Habyan tallied a 2.85 ERA in 74 games. Bob Welch led the team in wins with a 14-14 record despite having a 5.03 ERA.

SAN FRANCISCO SEALS

Three seasons and 259 victories have added up to a grand total of zero play-off appearances. The San Francisco Seals had another solid season, but were unable to crack the play-offs again after garnering 86 wins.

The Seals managed by Eric Nordan were led by All-Star Shortstop Cal Ripken. Ripken produced an incredible season in which he hit .305 with 200 hits, 27 homers, 101 runs, 120 RBI, 25 steals, 49 doubles, and only eight errors. Ripken's keystone partner, Robby Thompson, chipped in with .284 average and 21 home runs.

Kirby Puckett showed that he could still do the job in the outfield and hit .309 with 199 hits. Puckett also hit 23 home runs joining teammates Paul O'Neill (22), Ripken, and Thompson with 20 or more long balls.

The Seals pitching staff was a group effort as five pitchers won between 11 and 14 games. Zane Smith led the staff with 14 victories. Smith was followed by Mike Morgan who had 13, Roger McDowell had 12, and Kelly Downs and Frank Viola each had 11. McDowell also saved 20 games while working in a club record 94 games.

Balance is the word that fits the Seals perfectly. As a team they had an ERA of 3.89, 101 errors, and a batting average of .265. The Seals have been balanced each of their three years with 89, 84 and 86 wins. They have not seen any peaks or valleys, but in 1993 they will be shooting for a season on top and into the play-offs.

ARIZONA ARROWS

The 1992 Arrows had hopes of getting back to the playoffs with their offense. The Arrows were in the midst of a 3-way race for the Clemente Division title with the Apaches and Mustangs. They were only 4 games out of first with a 74-58 record until the bottom fell out. A loss at Salt River, plus getting swept 5 games by the Desert Diamonds led to a 1-9 record over the next 10 games, sealing their fate into the 3rd place spot.

The team was really hitting well until that late stretch where the Arrows couldn't even buy a run. Julio Franco set many Arrows' franchise records: batting (.333), at bats (643), hits (214), runs scored (115) and steals (81). He also contributed 28 doubles, 4 triples and 21 homeruns. He drove in 78 runs and sported a .389 on-base and .487 slugging percentage. His efforts won him All-SWBA second base honors. Felix Jose, acquired from the California Coolers stepped in to bat .290. He went to the plate over 670 times and responded with a team-leading 35 doubles and 9 triples, plus 16 dingers. He crossed the plate 98 times, second on the Arrows. Barry Bonds had his best year so far, earning him All-SWBA outfield honors. He finished with a .289 average, 24 doubles, 5 triples and a team high 32 homers for a .520 slugging percentage. He walked 95 times for a .392 on-base. To round out his game he scored 95 runs, drove in a team-high 113 and stole 61 bases. It's scary to look at his numbers and know he is young and still improving every year. Bip Roberts came over in a mid-season trade to try to give the offense an extra boost. He did a good job, but couldn't off-set the slumping players who were being depended on to produce. Shane Mack, in his first full year, was one of the players who fell off at the end. He hovered around .300 most of the season, but went into a tailspin to finish at .270. He did produce 24 doubles, 23 homeruns and was second on the team with 89 rbi. Fred McGriff was the biggest disappointment. Management always felt he should flourish with a short right field fence, but so far hasn't reached his potential. This year he batted a lowly .224 with only 23 round-trippers. He led the team with errors (19) and strikeouts (150). Jay Bell's .237 average was also disappointing, but his 14 homers were a plus and management feels he will still develop into a premier shortstop.

The Ageless Wonder was king of the hill for the 1992 Arrows. Nolan Ryan posted a 14-8 record with a 2.75 ERA. He allowed only 5.6 hits per 9 innings and fanned 10.2 batters per 9 innings. Melido Perez was re-acquired from the Glendale Giants and he finished with an excellent 2.56 ERA, but managed only a 9-10 record. Trevor Wilson was the only other starter to finish with a sub-4.00 ERA. He had a .500 record at 11-11, with a 3.88 ERA and a teamhigh 6 complete games. When one points fingers, Rob Dibble's ineffectiveness was probably the key stat. He was 4-7 with 20 saves and an unexpected 4.01 ERA. Management even acquired Mike Jackson in the Roberts deal to try to take the pressure off, but it wasn't meant to be. Middle relief was great. Jim Corsi sparkled with a 2.19 ERA and 6-3 record. The Arrows also dusted the cob webs off Goose Gossage who responded with a 3.27 ERA and 5-2 record. Arrows' rookie Bob Scanlan started and relieved to finish 6-8 with a very respectable 3.52 ERA. He only served up 3 homers in 102.1 innings. The Arrows management hopes that he will be competing with Dibble in spring training for the 1993 closer role. The Arrows added Randy Tomlin in mid-season to help bolster the starting pitching, but he wasn't really effective. The Arrows simply had too many innings above a 4.00 ERA to win the division.

The future looks bright for the Arrows. Bonds, Roberts, McGriff, Mack and Jay Bell are a good foundation for any team. The pitching staff will be getting the most attention in the off-season.

PHOENIX PHANTOMS

There is a first time for everything, and if first attempts are the most difficult, then the future of this expansion franchise must hold great promise. The Phoenix Phantoms ended their first season at a respectable 80-82, second place in the (admittedly weak) Aaron division. Before the first pitch of 1992, quality for quantity deals sent big names like Cecil Fielder and Jack Morris away for draft picks and young talent.

A pitching-plentiful expansion draft provided the team with a youthful starting pitching nucleus which would prove to be the glue that held the team together. Team MVP Ramon Martinez (3rd pick overall-1992 expansion draft) generated an enormous amount of team confidence. When Martinez pitched, the Phantoms were frequent winners. In his first year Martinez led the Phantoms starters in wins and ERA, and was one of only two Phantoms to attend the 1992 SWBA all-star game (and was the winning pitcher). Martinez was a tough act to follow, but another young starter, Andy Benes, was up for the challenge. Benes, (acquired in a pre-season trade for Cecil Fielder) was the team leader in starts and strikeouts, and though not as dominating as Martinez, was the workhorse among starters, and will likely be a mainstay on the Phoenix roster for years to come. Relief pitching has plenty of room for improvement, but strong performances were provided by the middle relief tandem of Rod Nichols and Russ Swan. The two pitchers donated well over 150 relief innings to the pitching cause, and more often than not kept the Phantoms in the lead or close in the late innings. After the mid-season trade of stopper Mike Schooler, closing duties fell into the lap of Mike Henneman. Henneman, though adequate in the role, was often overworked and had trouble getting the big outs in the clutch. Honorable mention also is in order for starter-reliever Kip Gross and shortman Mike Capel who helped ease some of the burden in a setup/closer rolein this bullpen of short relievers all named Mike. No pitching staff can win a division for an offense that has problems scoring runs. Unfortunately, this situation epitomizes the circumstances which kept the team from possibly winning a division in their first attempt.

The hitting woes can't be isolated to any specific area; this team just had too many one and two-run offensive performances. On a team lacking big home run numbers, run "manufacturing" was the preferred offensive strategy. The Phantom run-making tool of choice was the stolen base, compliments of speedsters Milt Cuyler and Tim Raines who proved to be a potent 1-2 combination at the top of the batting order. The unlikely hitting hero was catcher Mike Scioscia whose .280-plus average was tops amongst regular starters. Scioscia was the go-to guy in the batting order: he hit for average, hit for some power (8 home runs), could move the runners, and even aggravated opposing managers with the "you've got to be kidding me" steal (10+). Second baseman Harold Reynolds' bat was average for the team: He hit around .240, but he more than made up for it with speed and defense. Power was not plentiful, but was provided by the likes of Travis Fryman (20 HR) and Ivan Calderon. Right fielder Dave Justice was acquired during the season to add some voltage to the power supply, and immediately fit into the #4 slot. This young nucleus will help the Phantoms move away from scraping up sufficient quantity to get through a full season, and allow them to focus on improvements in the quality department. Some help from the next draft will assure Phoenix of a competitive season and another run for the division title in 1993.

PENNSYLVANIA SLUGGERS

Chris Dugan was hoping to contend in the tough Kaline division and was actually only 10 games out three-fourths through the season. The team managed only a 13-16 record the rest of the way and ended up 16 games behind the first place Warhawks.

Offensively, the bulk of the load was carried by Ryne Sandberg and Tony Phillips. Ryno responded with a respectable .279 average, leading the team with 165 hits and stroking 32 doubles and 25 homeruns. Ryne was tied with Howard Johnson for most runs scored at 93 and his 97 rbi were second to Hojo's 123. The star second baseman produced a .369 on-base percentage and a .477 slugging percentage. Tony Phillips had the next best average among Slugger regulars, hitting at a .260 clip. Tony drew 73 walks and finished with a .343 on-base. He chipped in 30 doubles, 4 triples and 13 four-baggers. Hojo led the team with a .510 slugging percentage, thanks to his 33 doubles, 10 triples and 37 dingers. The downside of Hojo was his .246 average, 29 errors and 127 strikeouts. The Sluggers hit 158 long ones which made them very dangerous in close games late, probably helping them to a better record than their overall stats would indicate.

On the hill, the Sluggers struggled. The big inning guys Mike Boddicker and Doug Drabek finished with ERA's of 4.87 and 5.00 respectively. They did manage 11 and 13 wins, but allowing over 10 hits per 9 innings was their downfall. Drabek, long the Pennsylvania ace, tied with Mike Bielecki for a team high 14 losses. The bullpen faired much better than the starting corps. Scott Radinsky allowed only 6.3 hits per 9 innings, with a 2.74 ERA, en route to a 3-8 record with 29 saves. Bill Landrum was fantastic in the set-up role with a 2.27 ERA, winning 7 games in relief. Cris Carpenter held his own with a 6-5 record, notching 8 saves with a 3.95 ERA in 55 games.

Looking to the future, the Sluggers still have a strong nucleus of players. You can't count out a team that includes: Sandberg, Phillips, Matt Nokes, Dave Winfield, Otis Nixon, Benito Santiago, Drabek, Radinsky, Randy Myers and Curt Schilling.

HANNIBAL CANNIBALS

The Hannibal Cannibals hovered around the .500 mark for most of the year before finishing at 78-84. Like most teams in the SWBA the Cannibals thrived at home and struggled on the road, but their overall record seemed to reflect their talent.

Offensively the Cannibals were led by Darryl Strawberry with 28 homers and 100 RBI. Craig Biggio was a big surprise hitting .305 and knocking in 89 runs while usually batting second or sixth in the lineup. Hal Morris and rookie Jeff Bagwell platooned effectively at first base but Morris didn't hit righties like in real life finishing at a disappointing .287. Kevin McReynolds had his usual steady year chipping in with 15 long balls and 88 RBI. Milt Thompson provided a much needed spark hitting .336 before running low on at-bats.

An inconsistent pitching staff plagued Hannibal throughout the year. Kevin Tapani led the staff with an 18-12 record while walking only 33 batters in 266 innings. John Smiley was a good number two starter going 14-10 with a 3.48 ERA. Unfortunately, David Wells and Bob Ojeda struggled all year. Alejandro Pena was solid out of the bullpen with 22 saves and a 2.69 ERA.

The best individual performance for the Cannibals this year came from rookie Mo Sanford. In a complete game 2-1 win over the Long Island Ducks, Sanford got his first SWBA win by scattering three hits and striking out 18 batters.

The Cannibals started the year with a good outlook toward the future. However, the future prospects like Sanford, Andujar Cedeno and Ryan Bowen will not be able to contribute in the near future. Add to that Darryl Strawberry's bad back and the trading of Bip Roberts (almost immediately after trading him he proceeded to hit .400 for about a month in real life) and 1993 looks bleak.

MINNESOTA MUDHENS

Once again, the season was a bust for Minnesota. Having lost Garrelts to an injury for the season the front office had to find a solid starter. By giving up its first round pick they acquired Kevin Appier.

Having limited starts by the rest of the staff, pressure was on Appier to register wins. The pressured proved too much as he went on to post a 9-18 record with an ERA of 4.14. The remaining starters all followed in succession by not having one starter get into double figures in the win column and also not achieving an ERA under 4.00 for the first time ever in franchise history.

The bullpen remained strong despite being busy. Wild Thing became the most valuable pitcher by posting a team record 19 saves and was the only pitcher to register 10 wins. Offensively the Hens remain somewhat consistent from the year before. Home run production did fall though. Kevin Mitchell and Kent Hrbek shared MVP honors. They hit 55 dingers with an average of .288 between the two of them.

So what can the fans expect in 93? By taking Lofton in the draft you'll see probably the fastest team in the league. Defensively it will be one of the best. Starting pitching will need some mending due to more catastrophic injuries to Garreltts, Dejesus and Williamson.

But through the draft and Appier as ace, it should be competitive with the rest of the division. Homerun production will be even less than '92 but speed on the bases should make up for it. Hitting for average is the most suspect spot for '93.

KODIAK ACES

The 1992 season saw the Kodiak Aces go from first to worst in their division. After losing the 1991 World Series, the Aces managed a league low 65 wins and had only the first overall pick to look forward to.

Again, Kodiak's pitching was their downfall. Only one Ace pitcher managed double digit wins. Tom Browning posted a 12-13 record and a 4.41 ERA. Tommy allowed a whopping 272 hits in 243.0 innings, or 10.1 hits per 9 innings. The old knuckleballer, Charlie Hough, was beaten 17 times, winning only 7 times with a 4.66 ERA. Jay Howell saved 31 games, somehow, with a 6.50 ERA and only 7 losses. Duane Ward was the brightest spot in the Kodiak pen. He managed a 7-7 record in 86 appearances for a 3.01 ERA. He also k'ed 11.2 batters every 9 innings pitched. Joel Hesketh went 8-8 with a reasonable 3.65 ERA and Jose Guzman added a 7-10 record and 3.73 ERA.

The infield duo of Wade Boggs and Carlos Baerga provided scoring punch to the Ace lineup. Wade hit .33 with 40 doubles and 87 runs. His .394 on-base percentage kept him on the basepath quite often. Baerga established himself as a premier player. He hit .315 with 37 doubles, 21 homeruns and 95 RBI. Dan Pasqua turned in a career year. He hit .292 with 21 doubles, 12 triples and 15 round-trippers. Altogether adding up to a .370 on-base and .494 slugging percentage. Terry Steinbach was very solid behind the plate. He hit .270 with 29 doubles. Andre Dawson stroked 24 homeruns to lead the team, but his .246 average was a big disappointment.

The future has to hold better things than 1992. A good draft to go along with a strong core of regulars should have the Aces competing for the division crown once again.
