The Arrows came into Norman, Oklahoma frustrated by the fact that they had lost the home field advantage for the post-season. John Smoltz, who came over in a mid-season deal from the Glendale Giants, took the mound for Arizona. Jaime Navarro was sent out to face him for Oklahoma. The first 3 innings were scoreless as each team could muster only two hits each. The Arrows exploded off Navarro in the 4th. Bip Roberts ed off with a double, Barry Bonds walked, Fred McGriff grounded out to the pitcher advancing the runners, Shane Mack singled home Roberts, Keith Miller singled home Bonds. Mike Stanley then walked to load the bases. With Jay Bell at the plate, Navarro threw a wild pitch to score Mack, and then gave up a 2-run single. Rickey Henderson capped off the inning with a 2-rbi homerun to send Navarro to the shower. John Smoltz allowed 4 hits and 2 unearned runs in 6.0 innings while fanning 9 for the win. Mack and Miller each turned in 3-5 performances.

Avery then bobbled McGriff's roller and all of a sudden, the winning run was on first and Avery was headed to the showers. Jeff Montgomery came in to put out the fire, but Shane Mack greeted him with a 2-run single to tie the game. Keith Miller, who had a very disappointing season, then put the Arrows up with a single to score McGriff. Rich Rodriguez came on to pitch a perfect two innings to save it for Eric Plunk.

Ray Lankford drew a pass as well and suddenly the bases were loaded for the 3-4-5 crew of Big Hurt, Gonzalez and Phil Plantier. Perez threw two wild pitches while Thomas was at the plate before yielding an rbi single. Gonzalez flew out for the first out, then Perez threw another in the dirt to Plantier. On the next pitch, Plantier doubled home Thomas. Ivan Rodriguez came up and singled in Plantier and Perez got the hook. Greg Hibbard came on to put out the fire, but the Switzers were boasting a 5-0 lead. Rickey Henderson led off the bottom half with a dinger to let the team no it wasn't over yet. In the second, Jay Bell got an rbi groundout and Hibbard and Barry Bonds had rbi singles to plate 3 runners to pull to a 5-4 deficit. In the 6 year history of the SWBA, no team had ever won 4 road games in a playoff series. At first, it didn't look like Arizona would even have a chance. John Smoltz gave up 6 hits in 5.1 innings and headed for the showers trailing 3-1. Frank Castillo started for Oklahoma and pitched 5.1 innings of 4-hit ball before going down with an injury. With one out and Joe Oliver on first in the 8th, Rickey Henderson hit his second homerun of the game off reliever Rusty Meacham to tie the game at 3. Shane Mack and Keith Miller added rbi singles and before the 8th was over, the Arrows had tallied 4 runs to take a 5-3 edge. Geronimo Pena singled home Walt Weiss in the bottom half, before Bob Scanlan fanned Robin Ventura to end the inning. Bip Roberts doubled home Joe Oliver in the top of the 9th for insurance, but Scanlan really didn't need it. The Arrows closer got Lankford, Thomas and Gonzalez in order to save the game. Rickey Henderson was named MVP of National Conference Championship. He batted .400 (10-25) with 2 doubles, 9 runs, 10 rbi and all **FIVE** Arrows' homeruns. Keith Miller, finally paid dividends. He hit .500 (11-22) after hitting in the .220's all season long. Bip Roberts was the 3rd Arrow to accumulate double figure hits with a 12-30 .400 performance. Jimmy Key (1-1 2.93) and John Smoltz (1-1 2.45) did their jobs as expected. Greg Hibbard gave the team a big boost, pitching 5.2 innings of shutout ball in his 3 appearances. Walt Weiss led all Oklahoma regulars with a 7-25 .280 performance. The 3-4-5 combination of Ray Lankford, Frank Thomas and Juan Gonzalez combined to hit .221 for the series. As a team the Arrows out hit the Switzers .251 to .211. Frank Castillo was 1-0 with a 1.59 ERA in 11.1 innings to lead the Switzers. Tom Gordon chipped in a 2.57 ERA, allowing only 1 hit in 7 innings of relief.

In one of the most controversial moves of his career, manager Joe Hornback lifted Jimmy Key for starter/reliever Greg Hibbard. It looked like a brilliant move in the bottom of the 3rd when Hibbard got all of a Rick Sutcliffe offering and rode it over the fence for a 2-run homer. The Aces came right back with an Andre Dawson solo shot in the 4th. Things fell apart in the 5th for Arizona. Rueben Amaro walked and went to 2nd when Bip Roberts mis-handled Rick Sutcliffe's bunt. Pat Listach then singled to load the bases. Hibbard walked in a run and hit the showers. Eric Plunk got Carlos Baerga to hit it to Keith Miller who threw it home for the force. Dawson then hit a long sacrifice fly, but Wade Boggs singled in some insurance for 3 unearned runs. Sutcliffe allowed only one hit after the third inning for the win. He finished the series 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA in 20.2 innings and was named Most Valuable Player of the World Series. Dante Bichette led all Kodiak regulars with a 10-30, .333, 5 run, 4 rbi, 2 SB performance. Barry Bonds was 2nd in MVP voting. Barry did everything he could. He was 10-24 for a .417 average. He drew 9 walks for a .576 OBP and add a double and 2 HR for .708 slugging. He also scored 8 runs, had 6 rbi and 4 SB's. The Aces out hit Arizona .263 to .255. Arizona had a 3.71 ERA to Kodiak's 3.86. Arizona committed 7 errors in 7 games after committing 125 all season. Looking back, manager Hornback wishes he'd opted for more right-handed starting pitching against the Ace's offense. Congratulations new World Champion John Dougherty.

OKLAHOMA SWITZERS

Three years of losing finally came to an end in '93 as the Switzers claimed both their first winning record and first division flag. A careful rebuilding plan paid off as Oklahoma fashioned the league's best regular-season record with the league's youngest team. A seven game playoff loss to the perennial league power Arizona Arrows could not detract from the excitement of the fine season posted by this emerging league power.

Entering the season, GM Pat Burroughs felt that if Manager Pat Burroughs would stay out of the way, the Switzers had an excellent shot at the Aaron Division title. After leading the SWBA in runs scored in 1992, it was obvious what the key to the '93 success of the Switzers would be and the ballclub DID get that improved pitching with the maturation of youngsters Steve Avery, Frank Castillo and Jaime Navarro. The staff ERA dropped from a league-worst 4.56 in '92 to a fine 3.36 mark in '93, while the offensive production dropped by ONE run from '92 (754/753). The pitching improvement resulted in a swing of 21 wins, 78-84 to 99-63. The Switzers stormed out of the chute with a 20-8 first-round mark and never looked back, though threatened at a couple of points in the season by the SouthWest Roughnecks. A winning record was posted in all but one round during the season.

Offensively, the Switzers had many contributors, including 1992 SWBA co-MVP Frank Thomas. The Big Hurt was his usual stat-sheet stuffing self. (Say **that** five times quickly). A disappointing .299 average was offset by 45 doubles, 19 homers, 103 runs, 95 RBI, 17 game-winners and 112 walks. Juan Gonzalez added a team-high 133 RBI, 19 game-winners, 95 runs and a team-record 50 homers. Ray Lankford contributed 34 doubles and 97 runs, Jerry Browne a .312 batting average and a .404 on-base percentage, and Robin Ventura 38 doubles, 98 runs and 87 walks.

Improved pitching cemented the division title, however. Navarro was the franchise's first 20-game winner at 20-6, and also paced the team with a 2.86 ERA. Avery and Castillo tossed in 17 and 14 wins respectively, forming a formidable 1-3 rotation bloc. The bullpen was solid, led by Jeff Montgomery's 39 saves. Turning in an outstanding season was right-hander Rusty Meacham, who posted 14 wins and a 1.78 ERA in 69 games, tossing 111 innings in a key middle relief role.

The Switzers now face the challenge of repeating, of maintaining a championship-caliber team while now being faced with not-so-favorable drafting position. Hopefully, the young nucleus of Frank Thomas, Juan Gonzalez, Robin Ventura, Phil Plantier, Ivan Rodriguez, Steve Avery, Wilson Alvarez and Tom Gordon will preclude having to fill too many holes in the quest for a league championship.

The trademark of the Arizona Arrows has always been their offense. Joe Hornback loves on-base percentage, speed and power. But, looking back at the most successful Arrow seasons, it has been pitching that has put them over the top. The Arrows staff pulled together a 3.72 ERA and allowed only 90 homers. The top three starters were all above the team average. Jimmy Key was not quite as sharp as expectations, but he still finished with a 16-8 mark and nice 3.51 ERA. Melido Perez turned in a 14-10 season, leading the Arrows with 7 complete games. Melido had 213 batters doing the shuffle back to the bench. John Smoltz also posted 14 wins and finished with 233 strikeouts. Bob Scanlan inherited the closer duties from Rob Dibble and Mike Jackson who were both sent packing with Felix Jose to the Cape Crusaders to get Jimmy Key and Rickey Henderson. The Scan-man responded with 39 saves, 7 wins and a 3.23 ERA. The Arrows had excellent set-up men in Eric Plunk and Rich Rodriguez. Plunk collected 8 wins and 5 saves to go with his 2.96 ERA. Rodriguez posted a 10-3 record with 8 saves and an even 3.00 ERA.

Nobody personifies Hornback's style any better than his favorite player, Barry Bonds. Bonds was the league MVP hitting 37 doubles, 32 homeruns, scoring 119 runs, driving in 105 and stealing 45 bases. He added 126 walks to his .320 average for a .455 on-base percentage. Bip Roberts was right behind Barry with 101 runs scored and .312 average. Newly acquired Rickey Henderson stole 43 bases, hit 14 homeruns and batted .305 for 90 runs scored. Shane Mack just missed hitting .300 with a .296 performance and just missed driving in 100 runs. Fred McGriff rounded out the fab five with 37 homeruns, 35 doubles, 131 rbi, 87 walks and a .277 average. Jay Bell had a good season, hitting .274 with 21 doubles, 4 triples and 8 dingers.

The future is always bright with the foundation of Bonds, McGriff, Roberts, Bell and Henderson. Jimmy Key and John Smoltz are a good pair to build a staff around, but the Arrows need to bring in some good young arms to stock the staff for years to come. One player they are expecting big things from is Mark Clark. He started 5 games this year, going 3-0 with one shutout and a good 3.65 ERA. Management hopes that Randy Tomlin can get his act together and become a 3-4 workhorse type of starter.

This was a very enjoyable season for manager Hornback. He only wishes he could re-tool that World Series rotation and see what would have happened. But then again, how many times will we ever see the visiting team win 14 straight games again, played by modem, in baseball????

RICHMOND STALLIONS

In just four seasons the Richmond Stallions have become the winningest team in the SWBA with a .569 percentage. Nick has put together an excellent combination of great pitching and good hitting that has resulted in three division championships, two World Series and one league championship.

While most other teams are struggling to have one starter under the 3.00 ERA mark, the Stallions finish with three there. Their fourth starter finished at 3.00, enough to lead most SWBA teams. Bobby Witt and Mike Mussina each won 18 games to combine for a 36-13 record. They were both difficult to hit with less than 8 hits per 9 innings. Witt finished with a 2.42 ERA and Mussina with a 2.44 mark. Alex Fernandez posted a 2.72 mark, but didn't get a lot of run support to finish at 10-10. Gooden finished 13-10 and tied Mussina with 5 complete games. The bullpen was even more impressive than the rotation. The pen boasted of five players who had ERA's below the minuscule team average of 2.86. Steve Olin finished with a remarkable 1.55 ERA. He notched 8 wins in his set-up role. The SWBA Reliever of the Year, Dennis Eckersley, tallied 44 saves with his 1.84 ERA. If the Stallions were ahead in the 9th, forget it. Mike Stanton came in from the pen to face mostly lefties and some righties, but finished 4-4 with 3 saves and a 2.23 average. The Stallions also got good pitching from Dennis Powell (6-4, 2.47) and Terry Leach (2-2, 2.64). The Stallions allowed only 81 homers all season.

At the plate, Mark McGwire did everything he could to out hit the opponents. He belted 43 homers, walked 104 times, scored 101 runs and drove in 109 to go with his .380 average. His efforts won him the selection of All-SWBA first baseman. Deion Sanders was the leading hitter among regular players. Although he didn't have enough at bats to qualify for the crown, he did hit .321 with 9 triples, 10 homers and 39 stolen bases. Daryl Hamilton continued to quietly impress everyone. He batted .283 with 23 doubles and 9 triples. He led the team with 65 stolen bases and was second in runs scored with 69. Reggie, the other Sanders, hit 21 doubles, 10 triples and 15 homers. He also batted .272 and stole 16 bases.

The Stallions will continue to go as far as their pitching will take them. Fortunately, there are some good, young arms on this staff. Offensively, the team needs to make some moves to keep the hitting fresh. Mark McGwire and Matt Williams are the best corner combination going when healthy, but they need some help.

KODIAK ACES

This was a year of many first for the Kodiak Aces. After a franchise record 97 losses in '92, the media and fans thought major changes would be made during the off-season. The management completed only one deal in acquiring the 3rd overall pick to go with the top pick in the '93 draft. Even after taking Pat Listach and Cal Eldred with those picks, the media picked the Aces to finish no higher than 2nd in the division because 28 of the 35 players were returning from the '92 team.

After finishing Round 1 with a 15-13 mark, it looked like the prediction would come true. Then after winning 17 games in Round 2 and taking over the division lead, optimism started to pick up. When the final out of the regular season was recorded, the Aces had won their 2nd division title in 3 years with a 93-79 record and completed a first-to-worst-to-first run.

The Aces used the stolen base to score runs as the power they enjoyed in previous years dropped to a team-low 80 homeruns. Andre Dawson accounted for 21 of those and Carlos Baerga hit 16. Pat Listach set a team record with 126 steals while hitting .286, Dante Bichette stole 47 bases and Eric Davis 24. Baerga was the offensive star for the team leading in hits (213), batting (.336) AND RBI (88). He was 2nd in runs scored to Listach with 85. He became the first player to reach the 200 hit plateau in Aces history. Pitching was a major surprise with the team ERA dipping to 3.19, another team record. Rick Sutcliffe, a 5th round pick in '92, surpassed expectations by posting 21 wins and a 2.55 ERA. Both of those are team records as well. Jose Guzman added 15 wins while putting up a 3.31 ERA. Team grandpa, Charlie Hough, was on the mound for 14 wins and rookie Cal Eldred chipped in another 10 wins. The bullpen was also strong with Jay Howell closing out 32 games with a 1.66 ERA and Duane Ward saved 21 more with an 0.83 ERA while fanning 104 hitters. Defense was the problem for the Aces as Wade Boggs, Listach and Baerga combined for 60 errors. The Aces suffered only a few 3-game losing streaks while the longest winning streak was 7 games from August 24-31.

Shades of '91 began to creep up as the team finished with the same record which was the worst of the four playoff teams, and 2 of the 3 other teams were involved in the '91 post-season. The Aces faced the favored Richmond Stallions, who beat the Aces in the '91 World Series, in the American Conference playoffs. The power outage continued as Stallion pitching held the Ace hitters to NO homeruns. But Kodiak blitzed the Stallions by stealing 10 of 15 bases and held them scoreless for 20 straight innings, allowing only 4 homeruns. Kodiak had avenged the earlier playoff loss by winning in seven and left the Richmond manager wondering what happened. The Aces then accomplished a feat never done before by beating the vaunted Arizona Arrows four times on the road while failing to win any games at home. A controversial pitching decision in Game 7 looked to be the ace in the hole for the Arrows, when Greg Hibbard popped a 2-run blast at home to give them the lead. But they found out Kodiak was holding the Aces when Duane Ward closed out a 4-2 victory to give Kodiak and their fans the first ever championship in franchise history.

The SWBA champion Kodiak Aces hope to repeat in 1994 with a good draft.

ARIZONA APACHES

The hallmark of the Apache franchise has always been pitching, pitching and more pitching. I also want to mention pitching. The Apaches have always been a team that sneaks up on you offensively. The names usually don't scare anyone, but before you know it, they've managed to get to first, steal or get bunted to second and are now crossing the plate.

Let's talk about the foundation first. His name is Greg Maddux. Maddux was drafted late in the original SWBA dispersal draft, after the likes of Al Pedrique and Bill Schroeder. Pat Mitchell, a diehard Cubs fan, knew what he was getting in the baby-faced Maddux. This may have been the biggest heist the SWBA has ever or will ever see. Shockingly, at 20-13 with a 2.72 ERA in 294.1 innings, Maddux was third in Apache starting pitcher ERA's. Bob Tewksbury boasted a 2.26 ERA to go with his 14-8 record. Ken Hill finished ahead of Maddux as well, with a 2.61 ERA and 14-9 record. Maddux led the team with 9 complete games, 6 shutouts and 217 strikeouts, while allowing only 7.58 hits per 9 innings. The Apache bullpen was awesome. John Franco and Gary Wayne combined for an 0.97 ERA and 16 saves in 83.2 innings from the port side. WOW! Roberto Hernandez notched an 8-8 record with 15 saves with a 2.83 ERA. Throw in lefties Derek Lilliquist (2.70) and Steve Howe (3.33) and the opponents never got a break.

The Arizona hitting displayed more pop than usual. Rob Deer belted 36 round-trippers and Mickey Tettleton added 26, but their sub .240 averages made them not as dependable. Mark Grace was the team offensive MVP. Grace legged out 37 doubles and 2 triples to go with his 7 homers. He had a team high batting average of .297 and drove in 86 runs to lead the team. Brett Butler excelled in the leadoff role as usual. He walked 100 times for a team-leading .379 on-base percentage. He led the team in runs with 85, triples with 11 and was second in stolen bases at 36. Mariano Duncan had a solid year coming in third on the team with a .431 slugging percentage. He racked up 34 doubles, 12 homers and 32 steals to go with his .270 average.

The pitching staff should be set for years to come with this team. The addition of second round draft pick John Valentin is going to help the offense out tremendously.

WAGRAM WARHAWKS

The 1993 Warhawks slipped 9 games under their last season record by winning only 88 games and finishing second in the Carew Division, 5 games back. The 1993 edition did increase their team batting average 10 points, from .256 in 1992 to .266 in 1993. However, the pitching wasn't up to par, as the team ERA jumped to 3.60 over last year's very respectable 3.27. The team power was also a disappointment, as the Warhawks could only manage 93 homers, with Tom Brunansky and Rafael Palmeiro leading the team with only 17 apiece. Wagram once again continued their transformation to a speed team by stealing a team record 207 bases, breaking the record set last year of 186.

The offense had no real leader, with Rafael Palmeiro being a slight disappointment. Although he hit .250 with 17 dingers and 92 RBI, his average hovered around the .220 mark most of the season and his power numbers were lower than expected. Wagram is expecting a big year for Palmeiro in 1994, as it is the final year of his contract. Chuck Knoblauch had another solid year, hitting .310, stealing 68 bases and scoring 104 runs. However, his average stayed around .345 most of the year, until a late season slump. Kevin Seitzer had a good year in his second tour of duty with Wagram, hitting .282 with 44 doubles, and Luis Polonia had a typical year hitting .285 and stealing 56 bases.

The team pitching lacked consistency in the starting rotation. However, once again Roger Clemens was the team MVP with a 21-6 record and a 2.05 ERA. The rest of the rotation included Bruce Hurst, Mike Moore, Hipolito Pichardo, Mark Portugal and Jim Deshaies. Of that group, only Portugal pitched well, going 9-3 with an ERA of 2.92, but only pitched 105 innings. He also had the first no-hitter in Wagram history. The remaining four had the following results: Hurst (5-19, 4.77), Moore (14-16, 4.56), Pichardo (6-6, 3.36) and Deshaies (4-7, 4.87). Greg A. Harris pitched well in the closer's role with 45 saves and a 2.71 ERA. Joe Boever (4-2-1, 3.18), Larry Andersen (12-3-1, 2.37) and Tom Edens (6-1-0, 1.91) all pitched well out of the pen. The remainder of the relief corps struggled all year.

Defensively, the Warhawks played uncharacteristically well, committing only 84 errors and 8 passed balls, a .986 fielding percentage. Chuck Knoblauch booted only 1 ball at second base all year and Kevin Seitzer only 10 at third.

The Warhawks are looking forward to the 1994 season with expansion and the switch to the DH rule. The 1994 projected lineup looks like: 1b-Palmeiro, 2b-Fletcher, ss-Knoblauch, 3b-Seitzer, c-Girardi/Slaughter, with an outfield consisting of Polonia, Ellis Burks, Vince Coleman, Randy Milligan and Eric Anthony. The starting rotation appears to include Clemens, Moore, Pichardo, Portugal and Deshaies. Middle relief appears to have a solid corps with Andersen, Boever and Edens. Greg A. Harris is slated to be the closer once again.

The SouthWest Roughnecks rode the bat of Ken Griffey, Jr. and the arm of Tim Belcher to 85 wins and a second place finish in the Aaron Division.

Junior was second in balloting to Barry Bonds for the league MVP. Ken belted 37 homers and 44 doubles, scored 103 times and batted in 123 runners to go with his .306 average. Edgar Martinez hit .294 and was just behind Griffey with 43 doubles and 102 runs. Edgar also led the team with 34 stolen bases. The rest of the Roughnecks stood in the shadow of these two, probably why the team finished 14 games behind the Switzers.

On the hill, Belcher went 20-4. He allowed only 6.95 hitters per 9 innings of work and struck out 167 batters. He had a very nice 2.63 ERA in 250 innings. Randy Johnson was being counted on for big things, but the big unit wasn't getting any run support. He had a good ERA at 3.26, allowed only 6.49 hitters per 9 innings and struck out 240 batters, but managed only a 10-14 record. Bill Swift was the do-it-all guy. He was counted on to do some spot starting and be the closer. He finished with a 9-12 record and 21 saves to go with his 2.20 ERA. If he would have had 2.2 more innings pitched, he would have qualified for a tie with the second best league ERA. Dave Stieb pitched well in limited action. Injuries kept him to just 104 innings, but he finished with a 6-2 record and brilliant 1.82 ERA. Jim Gott was the closer when Swift was rotating. Jimbo finished with 10 saves, 7 wins and a 2.43 average. Erik Hanson finished second with 14 wins, but had an even 5.00 ERA. It was nothing short of amazing how he ended up with only 12 losses after allowing 11.30 hitters to reach base every 9 innings.

Any team with Ken Griffey, Edgar Martinez, Jay Buhner and Randy Johnson (wait a minute, are these the Mariners) as a foundation, is not a bad place to start. The Roughnecks added the highly regarded Dave Nilsson in the draft. He should anchor their catching job for years to come. If this team can add one more pitcher and a really good on-base/leadoff man, look out....

The Cobras said goodbye to future Hall of Famers George Brett, Robin Yount and Tom Glavine during 1993, but are ready for the new year with a young nucleus consisting of: Tim Salmon, Moises Alou, Mel Rojas, Fryman, Hoiles, Mills, Harnisch and Nagy. Billy Ashley and Brian Hunter will be expected to provide future long ball power, with Jose DeLeon, Roger Mason, Mills and Rojas anchoring the pen for many seasons. Mark Langston and Dennis Martinez have been brought on to provide veteran stability to the rotation, with Frank Tanana and Bob Welch continuing to consume innings. Todd Zeile will be the mainstay at the hot corner with John Jaha assuming Bonilla's 1993 position - first base. PENNSYLVANIA SLUGGERS

Eighty-three and seventy-nine.

As baseball records go, it's not bad, but it's not spectacular, either. And as far as the Pennsylvania Sluggers are concerned, it's understandable and acceptable.

That's where the Sluggers finished the 1993 season, and although general/field manager Chris Dugan would rather have finished somewhere in the 90-plus win category, he knows he can't complain too much.

"When you have only two guys hitting the baseball and only two or three guys getting people out consistently, you can't expect to win a division title," said Dugan, a veteran of every SWBA season.

"Our pitching kept us above the .500 mark, but a lack of depth in the starting rotation and some simply lousy performances from our position players prevented us from making a strong run at the division title."

The Sluggers appeared ready to run away with the division title when they began the season with nine consecutive victories and 13 wins in the first 14 games. However, as both the pennant races and weather heated up the Sluggers cooled. They had a 12-game losing streak in August and the local media wasted no opportunity to take a shot at Dugan and the Sluggers.

"The Sluggers have choked so badly you can pull a Brunswick bowling ball from their throats," wrote one columnist.

Dugan is quick to point out that only Dave Winfield (.329, 34 doubles, 23 home runs) and Ryne Sandberg (.265, 33 doubles, 25 home runs, 99 RBI) were offensive threats. After Winfield and Sandberg, only one other player reached double figures in home runs - Matt Nokes with 11, but he batted only .195. Tony Phillips, who drew 113 walks, had an on-base percentage of just .365 because he batted .245 (and committed 24 errors). Wally Joyner had an awful year, hitting .217.

The Sluggers had a respectable pitching staff led by Curt Schilling, who had one of the best seasons in the SWBA. Schilling was 19-6 with a 2.20 ERA. He and Doug Drabek gave the Sluggers a solid 1-2 combination in the rotation.

Drabek pitched 273.2 innings and had an ERA of 2.86, but his record was only 15-14. Sid Fernandez was a disappointment, going 10-17 with a 4.18 ERA.

The team used a bullpen by committee as six pitchers had at least two saves. The same six, however, combined to lose 23 games.

The Sluggers, who are usually a postseason contender but has never made the SWBA playoffs, are now at a crossroads. They must either tear apart an aging team or continue trying to plug holes through the draft. The latter plan could prove to be more difficult as the team has been hampered by drafting in the middle of the pack for too many seasons.

CALIFORNIA COOLERS

The 1993 California Coolers continued their losing ways, but showed improvement from the previous year. While maintaining a solid core of veterans, management concentrated on acquiring young arms to replenish an aging pitching staff.

The Coolers finished 79-83, but could very well have finished above .500 with a little luck. The biggest hurdle that the team tripped on was its failure to win the close ones. The Coolers were involved in 48 one run games and managed to win only 22. Obviously a reversal of fortune in those games alone would have pushed the team to a winning record.

A glaring deficiency for California came at the plate. A franchise low team B.A. of .245 combined with what I'm sure is a SWBA record for futility... 66 home runs in 162 games! Off injured Jose Canseco led the meager assault on the fences with 15. Brian Harper had a solid year and lead the team in RBI with 78. Lance Johnson, batting around .300 all year, slumped late and finished at .278. Lance was a cause for concern for Cooler opponents though, as he was successful on 87% of his steal attempts and finished with 47.

California pitchers on the other hand, kept the team in almost every game. The Cooler staff finished with a franchise best 3.35 ERA. Starter Chris Bosio just missed winning 20 games, and had the best year in Cooler history by finishing at 19-7 and a 2.58 ERA in 244 inn. Closer Doug Jones mirrored Bosio with an outstanding performance, going 2-2, with 45 saves, 1.88 ERA and WHIP of .899.

In 1994, management will continue to try to bring in younger bodies, realizing that the franchise is probably still a couple of years from turning the corner for good. A potent line-up featuring Lance Johnson, John Olerud, Roberto Kelly, Brian Harper and Dave Hollins will try to offset what looks to be a dismal year for the pitchers. One guarantee here, no lead will be safe at Wrigley next year!

Steve Scott's first full season in the SWBA saw a pretty productive offense get frustrated by the pitching staff. The Rangers belted 110 homeruns, but the pitchers gave up 140. They scored 653 runs, but gave up 669. It was one of those seasons that make you go bald.

Harold Baines and Mike Bordick led all regulars with .301 averages. Harold did have a power outage, with only 21 of his 128 hits going for extra bases. Bordick fared a little better in the pop department with 23 doubles, 3 triples and 6 round-trippers. He also tied for second in runs scored with 71. The Wizard, Ozzie Smith, was magical, stealing 63 bases and scoring 71 runs. He hit .283 and played steady in the field. Darren Daulton was the team offensive MVP and first team SWBA All-Star catcher. Daulton hit .279, was second on the team with 28 doubles, first with 23 homers, 78 runs, 86 RBI and 107 walks. He had an excellent .408 average and led all regulars with a .484 slugging percentage. Sid Bream turned in a very solid season as well. Sid batted .275, led the team with 31 doubles and was second with 12 homeruns.

On the mound, Omar Olivares led the team with 12 wins and 155 strikeouts. He finished with a 3.87 ERA. John Burkett tallied a 10-10 record, with a superb 2.57 ERA, but just couldn't get the run support he needed. The mis-fortunes of the season came mostly at the hands of Chris Hammond and Ricky Bones. They combined to go 11-27 with an ERA in excess of 5.30. Tough when you need them for 325+ innings. Mike, the other Maddux, had a career year with a 8-3 record, 5 saves and a 1.87 ERA. Mike Munoz pitched very well from the pen as well, with a 2.76 average. Rick Aguilera had a good year with 26 saves and a 3.40 ERA, but blew a lot of opportunities as his 4-13 record indicates.

ROLLING MEADOWS ROADRUNNERS

It was a year of transition for the Roadrunners. By the end of the expansion draft, only 13 players were left on the roster who were with the team at the end of the prior year when the franchise was the Scottsdale Scorpions. In fact, only Paul Molitor and Spike Owen remained from the original 1988 telephone dispersal draft.

Last year's draft goal of drafting an everyday centerfielder appears to have been accomplished. The draft yielded Chuck Carr and Ryan Thompson. The Roadrunners are armed with 14 draft choices in the first 6 rounds of the upcoming draft. There is very little pitching left on the roster and upgrades are needed at second and short. Hopefully the Roadrunners will have the bats sorted out after the next season.

In the case of the Roadrunners, a hard look at the statistics does tell the story. The Roadrunners were near the top in all offensive categories except on-base percentage and walks. In addition, the pitching staff had a 4.00 ERA. The offense only seemed to sink or swim on the individual performances of three of the four first batters - Bernard Gilkey, Paul Molitor and Albert Belle. Most notably, Molitor had 200 hits, while batting .307 and stealing 44 bases. Belle hit 33 homeruns and drove in 99 runs.

David Cone seemed to be a hard luck pitcher. He pitched just good enough to lose. Cone had a 12-15 record, while pitching 270.1 innings, allowing 241 hits and striking out 265 batters. Most games were lost by all levels of relief pitching. Nobody emerged who could effectively hold inherited runners or nail down a save.

The Roadrunners look forward to their second season in Milwaukee County Stadium. Expectations are for an improved team adding final seasoning to a young nucleus. Another sub-.500 season is probably in the offing.

PHOENIX PHANTOMS

After finishing the 1992 season in 2nd place, the Phantoms had high hopes for their second season. But, the second year of the fell short of their expectations. Still, they managed an Aaron Division third place finish with 71 wins.

The strength of the Phantoms is their pitching. A very strong top five was anchored by Tom Glavine. Tom posted a 14-12 season with a staff high 3.11 ERA. That has to be considered an excellent performance in a league that usually roughs up southpaws. Tom was tough to hit, allowing only 7.44 hits per 9 innings. He was even tougher to take deep, serving up only 12 taters in 234.2 innings. Ramon Martinez made the best of his 152.1 innings with 3 shutouts and a 3.25 ERA. His 3 shutouts were second only to Glavine's 4. Andy Benes was the workhorse with 250.1 innings and had a fine 3.42 ERA. He just couldn't get the run support he needed and finished with a 10-14 record. He did fan the batters though, setting 8.13 down every 9 innings, which was second only to the fireballing John Wetteland. Wetteland was the ace closer, notching 35 saves and striking out 88 batters in 76.1 innings. When the game was close, one also had to deal with the setup man Mike Henneman. Henneman posted a 6-7 record with 5 saves and a 3.27 ERA. Danny Jackson was second on the team in wins, but giving up 10.13 hits every 9 innings hurt him and resulted in his 4.27 ERA.

Offensively, the Phantoms disappointed manager Michael Hedt and general manager Doug Ambrose. No regular was even close to the .300 plateau and the team managed only 83 homeruns. Dave Justice had the most pop, hitting 16 dingers, but his .222 batting average didn't scare too many teams. Tim Lincecum may have been the best all around performer. He led the team with 27 doubles, 9 triples and 72 runs scored; had 8 homeruns; walked 61 times and stole 58 bases. Ron Gant finished second with 63 runs and 52 rbi, but his .225 average made the season nothing to write home about.

The future looks much brighter on this team. Most of the veterans are not that old and there are some up-and-coming kids who should make an impact in the near future. Hedt and Ambrose are looking forward to the future.

CAPE CRUSADERS

The Cape Crusaders fell to the bottom of their division after winning 90 games in 1992. Second year manager Brian Pelletier watched his pitching staff give it every effort, only to come up on the short end of the stick 95 times. Jose Rijo did everything he could to keep things going. He pitched 216.1 innings with an excellent 2.91 ERA, but managed only an 8-11 record. Lefty Greg Swindell had the most wins, posting a 15-10 record with a 3.56 ERA in 217.2 innings. Swindell also led the team with 3 shutouts. Jack McDowell led the Crusaders with 5 complete games and had a decent 3.69 ERA, but his 21 losses tied him with Hannibal's John Smiley for the SWBA high. Rob Dibble came over from the Arizona Arrows and fell one short of saving half of the Crusader victories. He tallied 33 saves, had an ERA of 1.86 and led the SWBA with 13.29 strikeouts per 9 innings. Mike Jackson and Kent Mercker also pitched very well from the bullpen.

Offensively, the toughest thing for the Crusaders to do was hit the ball out of the park. Chris Sabo led the team with 14 dingers, but struggled with a .227 average. Felix Jose came over in the Rickey Henderson deal to lead the regulars in hitting. Jose boasted a .311 average with 23 doubles and 12 homeruns. He was second on the team in RBI, third in scoring and second in stolen bases. Mel Hall performed very well. He led the team in doubles with 34 and was tied for the team lead with 6 triples. Lenny Dykstra led the team with 54 stolen bases and batted .279 in the leadoff spot. Barry Larkin led the team in runs with 69 and in walks with 42. He also hit .270 and stole 22 bases. Joe Carter drove in 67 runs to lead the team and was second with 32 doubles.

The Crusaders should easily improve on their 1993 record. There are some really good, young players on this team that should make the team competitive for years to come. Leading off the 1993 season, the Mudhens joined the technological age when Owner/Manager Dennis Michurski signed his brother, Gary Michurski, to the organization to be General Manager. Gary's role for the Mudhens will be overseeing player development and facility operations.

"I feel I can help, not only this ballclub, but also impact the entire league. By joining the computer age and being a fan of baseball, I can assist Denny with his managerial decisions as they happen and help the commissioner out, and keep the league operating as efficiently as possible," said Gary upon his announcement.

Despite the front office acquisition, the Mudhens fell to last place in their division. "We just kept losing the close games and seemed to leave a lot of guys on base. We were only outscored by less than one run per game on average for the year. Our clutch hitting let us down this year," were Manager Michurski's comments summarizing the year.

Team strengths last year came from Kevin Appier, the only 'hen pitcher with double digit wins at 11, (despite losing 14); Bill Sampen 6-0, in only 87 innings; and Steve Farr picking up 23 saves. Kenny Lofton stole 69 bases, Kent Hrbek waited out 79 walks and punched out a team-high 11 homeruns. Thomas Howard obtained the highest average at .286. Homerun production was down with 'hen pitchers giving up twice as many as the 'hens hit. Something one would not expect for the home team at the Humphrey MetroDome. Team MVP honors go to Lofton due to his respectable on-base percentage, and finishing in the top ten in triples and stolen bases. "If we could have had a little luck go our way, I think the outcomes on some of these games would have gone in our favor," Dennis said.

The loss of Scott Leius for the year due to a shoulder injury will force the team to look for infield help. The Mudhens will be using their excellent spot for the draft to assist them in hitting and supporting a strong pitching staff. Also, they have enough talent to work out some trades to fill any gaps. If they can bolster their offense, and can get a little of that luck, the Mudhens shouldn't be stuck in the mud at the bottom of their division next year.
