

Darrin Jackson started off a 2-3 day with an rbi double in the bottom of the first that put the Tigers ahead to stay. Jose Oquendo, who performed superbly all season for manager Pat Mitchell, also got two hits, with 2 rbi in 4 trips. John Tudor allowed just 3 hits in 7 innings for the win.

Game 2

The teams battled into the 10th inning as Jersey gained a split at Tempe. Dale Sveum had an rbi single in the 7th that gave JST the lead until Lenny Harris' single tied it in the bottom of the 9th. R.J. Reynolds' error on the first play of the 10th put Garry Templeton on 2b. Phil Bradley then drove him in with a pinch-hit single. In an inning that saw another error, a passed ball, a balk and a sacrifice fly, the Tides tallied three more runs to take a commanding 5-1 lead into the bottom half. A leadoff triple and run by Mookie Wilson excited the home crowd, but a JST double play quieted them and the Tides won it.

The first three Tiger batters reached base in the 9th and Carney Lansford hit an rbi single to make it 5-3. Then with two outs, Steve Lyons singled in another run, 5-4 Tides. Pat Tabler and Brett Butler then hit back-to-back 2-run singles giving the Tigers a come-from-behind victory. Strawberry was a perfect 4-4 on the day with a double. Lansford was 3-4 for Tempe.

Kevin McReynolds blasted a Don August offering in the top of the 3rd inning to give Jersey a 2-0 lead. Bob Ojeda rode the narrow lead through the 7th inning before yielding a run and heading for the shower. Ace reliever Dan Plesac of the Tides couldn't hold off the Tigers in the 9th as they tallied a run to force extra innings. It was not to be for Joe Zinkowicz's squad as the Tiger bullpen allowed only 2 walks in the last 4 innings of the game. With one out in the bottom of the 10th, Brett Butler hit an rbi triple that plated the winner and put the Tigers into the SWBA World Series. Jose Oquendo was a perfect 4-4 at the plate with a double, homerun, rbi and 2 runs scored. R.J. Reynolds turned in a 3-4 outing with a solo homerun.

The Labelers began their second campaign for making the World Series by sending rookie Shawn Hillegas to face Humidity ace workhorse Dave Stewart. Both teams threatened early: the Humidity opened the first with a Jody Reed single and Ron Oester walk; and opened the 5th with a Dwight Evans 3 bagger - both times the Humidity runners were denied home. Labeler runners reached scoring position three times in the first 3 innings without a score. It took an inning opening single by B.J. Surhoff, followed by an Ozzie Guillen triple to break the deadlock. When Labeler pitcher Rich Dotson walked pinch-hitter Dwayne Murphy to start the 8th, Manager

Bill Samuels did not hesitate to summon his workhorse, Mark Davis for the save.

The Labelers hoped to go 2 up when they sent Tom Candiotti to face Greg Mathews. The Labelers struggled in their only regular season shot at Mathews, today that was going to change, slowly. The Humidity jumped all over Candiotti in the second, with 2 outs and 1 man on Carlton Fisk singled and Terry Pendleton line a homerun for a 3-0 lead. The Humidity drove to a 5-run lead over Candiotti after 4-1/2 innings. Solo dingers by Chris James, Gary Redus and Barry Bonds sent the score to 6-3 and Mathews to the showers in the bottom of the 5th. A 3-run 6th for Samuels' Labelers evened the score at 6. As Chuck Crim won the opening game, he lost this one. With one out, Crim hit Fisk with his first pitch. Vince Coleman pinch-ran, promptly stole second and scored on Dwayne Murphy's pinch single. Dennis Eckersley closed out the last 2 innings for a save.

Game 3

After splitting the first two games of the SWBA playoff series, West Coast and Gulf Coast rolled into aging Comiskey Park for games 3, 4 and 5. Mike Dunne took the hill for the Labelers and southpaw Floyd Bannister was on the mound for the Humidity. Joey Meyer jumped on Floyd early with a two-run blast in the 1st. West Coast struck again in the 3rd. Gary Redus led off with a base hit and stole second. Wade Boggs followed that with a run scoring single to put the Labelers up 3-0. But the Labelers started to unwind in the 4th. Mike Greenwell led off with a walk and went to third on a single by Willie McGee. Greenwell then scored on a wild pitch Gulf Coast would tie it up in the following inning. by Dunne. Meyer booted a Jody Reed grounder to start the rally. Ron Oester followed with a single and Ken Phelps walked. Greenwell then blasted a double to score both runners. The Labelers loaded the bases in the 7th on Al Nipper. Manager Chris Yeager went to his ace early to put out the fire. Eck came through by fanning Meyer. Oester led the 7th off with a single and Vince Coleman pinch ran and stole second. The Humidity scored in the first inning as Ken Phelps drew a 2-out walk. Mike Greenwell then singled as did Carlton Fisk to load the bases. Candiotti then walked Dwight Evans for the game winner. Phelps added insurance with a two-run shot in the 3rd.

In the bottom of the 10th, Redus was hit by Al Nipper's offering, went to second on a ground ball to third and scored on Gwynn's single.

The game went extra innings and Gulf Coast almost scored in the top of the 10th, but Dwight Evans was cut down by Ozzie Guillen's relay throw to the plate from Claudell Washington after Mike Greenwell's two-out single. The Humidity bullpen allowed only one single in

the last 4.2 innings. Terry Pendleton led off the top of the 11th inning with a single. Keith Hernandez then brightened up an 0-4 day with a 2-run shot off game 6 winner Rick Honeycutt. The Labelers went down in order in the bottom half and the Gulf Coast Humidity advanced to the World Series.

The Humidity pitchers could not get the motivated Tigers out. Mookie Wilson turned in a 4-4 day. Mark Grace went 3-5 with a triple and 4 rbi. Brett Butler also collected two doubles turning in a 3-6 performance.

Tempe Tigers

Behind a one-two pitching combo of Greg Maddux and John Tudor (33 victories), Tempe improved 18 games over the previous season. Not too surprisingly, Maddux and Tudor only won 11 games the season before. The stability they added to the starting rotation was the difference, and they had 68 starts between them. Maddux was a 29th round draft pick for Tempe in 1988 and was pounded to the tune of a 5.07 ERA in the initial SWBA season; this year he posted a 19-14 record, had 5 complete games and a 3.21 ERA in 266 innings. Tudor added 14 wins and a 2.99 ERA in 192 innings. The biggest surprise of the season was part-time starter Mark Grant who finished at 11-4 with 5 road wins; his ERA was not eyecatching, but he got a decision in 15 of the 22 games he was in. John Franco had a super season highlighted by a 41 consecutive inning scoreless streak. (including 9 innings in one wild game vs. Gulf Coast that lasted 24 innings.) Franco's 1.01 ERA and 29 saves led the Tigers relief corps.

The 1989 MVP (offensively) was Jose Oquendo. Forced to play out of position at shortstop, Jose had 16 HR's, 83 RBI, 9 GW, .291 AVG and aside from the fact that he committed 31 errors, was the clutch player all season long. His surprising power all came vs. left handed pitching. His clutch play was exemplified during his World Series performance. Jose went 10 for 27 (.370). He hit one of only 2 HR's during the Series, had 2 GW and 5 RBI. Other key contributions were made by 1st round draft pick Mark Grace, who although hit only .267, had 69 RBI and 10 GW's. The most important pre-season acquisition was Rob Deer, as his 20 homers led the team that hit only 102 homeruns all season. Deer's 89 RBI (11 GW) also led the team.

Pat Tabler edged out Mookie Wilson for the team batting title, .369 to .367; and Brett Butler led the team with 106 runs scored and 37 stolen bases.

West Coast Labelers

The 1989 SWBA season provided much more excitement to Labeler fans than was initially expected. Entering the season, the Labeler manager anticipated a rebuilding year. Manager Bill Samuels knew he had the offense, but questioned the pitching, especially the starters. Offseason trades brought over Tony Gwynn and Don Carman.

When the Labelers were solidly in 2nd place after 2 rounds, they knew they had a chance to improve on last year's 86-76 playoff team. As things turned out, the performance of the '89 Labelers was almost an exact duplicate of the '88 team. This team entered the final two rounds with a virtual lock on the last playoff spot. As was true in '88, the team barely held off the California Coolers to repeat their '88 playoff trip.

This year's key to the season and clear MVP was reliever Mark Davis. Wade Boggs led the team in hitting for the second consecutive year with a .329 clip. Top '89 draft pick, Roberto Alomar solidified the infield and provided a solid bat. Pleasant surprises this season were '89 late round draft picks Bud Black (2.91 ERA) and Norm Charlton (3-1, 1 CG).

Looking to next year, the Labelers will return a solid offense and even deeper bullpen. However, the starting rotation continues to weaken as does the power in the Labelers' bats. Barry Bonds was traded to expansion team Philadelphia Mob for Bobby Witt and a 2nd round draft pick. The departure of Bonds, the Labelers' only legitimate power hitter, will place an even heavier burden on the hitting of Boggs and both the hitting and speed of Gwynn and Alomar. It is hoped that newly acquired Witt will realize his potential as the Labelers' #3 starter next season. Obviously, Manager Bill Samuels will be looking for some big bats and starting pitching as the '90 season approaches.

California Coolers

The defending National Division Champions were on a roller coaster all year, as a mediocre offense and an inconsistent bullpen led to a 3rd place finish, one game out of second and a return to the playoffs.

California started fast, winning 12 of 17 to open the season. The pitching staff started well, allowing an opponent 5 or more runs only 3 times. The Coolers went 7-2 on the road. California went down hill fast though, as they lost 11 of the next 17, including 5 straight. Like last year, the Coolers avoided long losing streaks with 5 being the longest. By the same token, 5 was the longest winning streak that could be mustered.

Offensive MVP is shared again this year by 2 players. Tony Fernandez two years running and Jose Canseco. Canseco just narrowly missed becoming the SWBA's first 40-40 man, finishing with 42 stolen bases and 39 homeruns. Fernandez again set the table, stepping into the lead off spot after Vince Coleman was traded. Tony led the team in hits (200), doubles (40), triples (8) and was 2nd in runs (82).

Surprises at the plate included Marvell Wynne and Luis Salazar. Wynne had 33 extra base hits and batted .304. Salazar, after a slow start, came on strong and led the team in batting at .311 and played a solid third base. Last year's co-MVP, Mark McGwire, never got untracked and ended the year at .250 and only 25 homeruns.

Andy Hawkins led the starters with a 17-9 record despite a 4.03 ERA. Also with double digits in the win column were Jerry Reuss 13-8, 3.01, and Curt Young 10-7, 3.83. Rick Rhoden, last year's starting ace, had no support or luck and finished 8-18 with a 3.83 ERA. Doug Jones, the designated stopper, did an excellent job, gaining a team record 33 saves and posted a 4-5 record.

Next year looks to be a rebuilding year as many positions need to be filled. Holes in the outfield and third are a priority. Starting pitching will be mediocre at best, so a deep and talented bullpen will get the call often.

Gulf Coast Humidity

The Gulf Coast Humidity made some bold moves to start the 1989 campaign. After a disappointing 4th place finish in the SWBA's inaugural season, GM Chris Yeager mad some wholesale changes in order to make a run at the title. The lack of homerun pop was evident as the Humidity finished dead last in homers in the previous season. So GCH dealt the best hitter in baseball(w/ the exception of Wade Boggs) for the hitting and leadership of Dwight Evans and a first round draft pick in the 1990 draft. Yeager went for power again as he gambled on a natural DH in a no DH league; Ken Phelps was the second round selection. Gulf Coast was also short in the starting pitching area, so star shortstop Shawon Dunston was dealt in exchange for aging veteran Floyd Bannister. Gulf Coast's final move was the acquisition of Vince Coleman and Al Nipper from California in exchange for Todd Burns. To replace the void left by the Dunston trade, Jody Reed was made the first round draft pick.

The season opened with an enjoyable face to face series with Robert White's California Coolers. Gulf Coast dropped 2 of 3 and was off to a slightly sluggish start at the end of round one. They finished the round at 14-13 with disappointing performances from Reed(.146) and Dennis Rasmussen (0-5, 5.61 ERA). Dwight Evans (.390 OBP) and Dennis Eckersley (15 IP, 0 ER, 5 S) opened the season well. The Humidity heated up in Round 2 with a 9-1 homestand and raised their record to 29-20.

The end of Round 3 saw the arrival of mid-season with Gulf Coast near the top. The Humidity experienced it's greatest winning streak ever, going undefeated from June 29 to July 8, compiling 9 straight wins. Eckersley had 21 saves, Stewart was 9-7 with a 3.49 ERA. In game 74, Rasmussen got his first win against 8 losses. Gulf Coast hit the mid-way mark at 45-35.

Gulf Coast shot into 1st in Round 4, finishing at 62-45. The starting pitching in the round was nothing short of amazing. GCH started the round with 3 complete games and finished it with 12. Bannister tossed 5 consecutive! Stewart posted a 6-0 record. Mike Greenwell made sure the bats weren't silent. In an amazing string, Greenie reached base 14 consecutive times; his average jumped from .306 to .341 in the round. Evans' average slumped to .250, but his 76 rbi led the club. Willie McGee, Phelps and Keith Hernandez also improved solid seasons. The season wasn't over, however and every one could see that they were slipping fast. GCII had a tough Round 5 and were hanging on by a string. The Humidity was evaporating quickly and a 10-13 Round 6 was just enough to win the division title.

Gulf Coast bounced back from the slide and won the playoff series from West Coast in dramatic fashion with a tremendous 2-run blast in the 11th by Hernandez. Jersey Shore Tides

The Jersey Shore Tides concluded their second season in the SWBA with a record of 84-78, good for a second place finish in the American Division. The Tides missed the division championship by finishing one game behind Gulf Coast. The club qualified for the playoffs by edging out third place Pennsylvania by a game.

Darryl Strawberry captured most of the offensive headlines with 54 homeruns and 126 RBI. The rightfielder's .293 batting average led all regulars. Kevin McReynolds provided the power from the righthand side with 34 dingers and 102 runs knocked in. Slugging tailed off sharply after Strawberry and McReynolds as the club hit a total of 164 roundtrippers, 45 less than the inaugural season.

Ted Higuera continued to be the ace of the starting staff, posting 13 wins and an ERA of 2.60. Higuera also led the staff in strikeouts with 185. Dan Plesac saved 25 games for Jersey Shore. Mike Jackson pitched in with 15.

Pennsylvania Sluggers

Consistently Inconsistent! If nothing else, you can call the Pennsylvania Sluggers consistent. The Sluggers finished with an 83-79 record and a third place finish in the American Division for the second consecutive season.

And that's not the only similarities between the two seasons. The Sluggers batted only four points less (.260) in '89 than in '88 (.264), hit one less double (257-258) and scored 10 less runs (728-738).

Another similarity between the two seasons was in the pitching. For the second consecutive season, the Sluggers struggled on the mound. But in '89, it was the bullpen that did the majority of the struggling. The bullpen's inability to hold leads was the team's biggest problem.

Jeff Robinson, who had a team-high 26 saves in '88, saw his ERA skyrocket to 4.80 with nine losses and only 8 saves. Tim Birtsas had a 5.17 ERA and lost four games. The bullpen also found it very difficult to keep the ball in the park. Robinson served up 16 homeruns in 110 innings, while Birtsas gave up a whopping 14 in only 69.2 innings. Randy Myers, who gave up only 5 dingers in the '88 Major League season yielded 11 gopher balls in 71 innings.

The starting pitching improved, but was still mediocre at best. Sid Fernandez had an 11-10 record, hardly an impressive record for the ace of the staff. Fernandez did strike out 203. Doug Drabek had an impressive 3.28 ERA with two shutouts, but his record was only 11-15. And if there was one thing that puzzled manager Chris Dugan, it was the performance of Mike Boddicker. The Sluggers' first selection in the '89 draft, Boddicker won only one of his first 15 starts, but rebounded to win 12 of his last 16 decisions. Will the real Mike Boddicker please stand up.

Offensively, Dave Winfield had a super season. The veteran right fielder was named the team's MVP after batting .323 with 47 doubles, 26 homeruns, 111 runs and 120 RBI. Rafael Palmeiro also had a solid season, batting .297 with 43 doubles. But Winfield and Palmeiro were the only regulars who batted better than .274. Pedro Guerrero batted .281, but injuries limited him to only 381 at-bats.

The Sluggers managed to improve their fielding, but it still has a long way to go before it can be called good. After leading the SWBA in errors in 1988, the Sluggers cut their total from 137 to 119. Benito Santiago has been the biggest scatter-arm of the bunch. He committed a team-high 17 errors last year to bring his two-year total to 43. The Slugger pitchers have also had trouble fielding. Drabek committed an amazing 16 errors last season.

Over the two seasons, the Sluggers have shown the characteristic of being slow starters. They have a record of 13-23 in games of Round 1 over the past two seasons. A better start is a must if the team is to make the playoffs in 1990.

As for next season, the Sluggers will be looking for help in the outfield because of Winfield's bad back that will likely keep him out for the entire season. They will also be shopping firstbasemen Palmeiro and Guerrero in an attempt to fill some holes in the outfield and pitching staff.

Sagebrush Seminoles

Bill Guerra took over the talented Tasmania Devils team, moved them to Florida and improved them from a 78-84 record in 1988 to 82-80 in 1989. After struggling to a 37-44 record at the half-way point, only Pennsylvania's 47-34 record in the second half was better than Sagebrush's 45-46 clip. Sagebrush had a season high 6 game winning streak, but lost 8 in a row in the first half that hampered their efforts at making a run for the 2nd National Division playoff spot.

Offensively, the Seminoles got a big season out of Ellis Burks. He led the team in batting average, hits, doubles and runs, and tied George Bell for the lead in triples. Bell, who came over from the Arrows during the off-season, led the team in homeruns, rbi and game-winners. Overall, the Seminoles were second in the SWBA in walks and steals.

On the mound, Sagebrush had the league's top ERA man in Chris Bosio. Bosio finished with a 12-7 mark with a 2.24 ERA. Roger McDowell and Todd Worrell combined for 28 saves with a sub-2.50 ERA collectively. Dwight Gooden was 5th in the league with 16 wins, striking out 184 batters in 245.2 innings. He also completed 10 games, shutting out the opponents 3 times. Bill Wegman did a good job finishing at 10-9 with a 3.56 ERA.

Looking to the 1990 season. Manager Guerra expects to have comeback numbers from Nick Esasky, Ozzie Smith, Willie Randolph and Bob Welch. Consistent years from Burks, Bell, super-sub Lloyd McClendon and rookie Junior Felix could make Sagebrush an offense that can't be overlooked by opponents. The starting rotation will be by committee and their effectiveness will determine Sagebrush's success.

Meadville Grays

All in all, it was a decent year for the Grays. After a quick start, the Grays settled back into a struggle to finish at the .500 mark. While they finished two games short at 79-83, the team was competitive most of the time.

Joe Carter was clearly the MVP, finishing with 48 doubles, 27 homeruns and 124 runs batted in. Rickey Henderson stole 86 bases, scored 109 runs and led the regulars with a .284 average. Rookies Chris Sabo and Ricky Jordan also made significant contributions. Sabo rapped 48 doubles and Jordan hit .313.

While no pitcher won more than 13 games, the staff as a whole was solid. The top pitcher was Jose Rijo. Used almost exclusively in relief, he finished with a 2.36 ERA and 11 saves after taking over as the closer at the 2/3 mark when Bobby Thigpen became ineffective.

The outlook for 1990 is hopeful. The pitching staff is relatively young and deep, and the players on the field appear solid, especially in the outfield. To achieve a winning record, however, the Grays must improve their depth and especially strengthen their catching.

Arizona Arrows

Disappointing would be the title of the 1989 Arrows campaign. After making some off-season deals that brought in stars Fred McGriff and Joe Magrane, the team still got hammered and finished last in the National Division.

Offensively, big things were expected out of LH sticks McGriff and center fielder Andy Van Slyke. The acquisition of right fielder Paul O'Neill gave the Arrows a torrid 3-4-5 lineup against right-handed pitchers. ARA opponents responded by throwing lefties at every opportunity. As a result, the dreaded trio slumped below expectations. The biggest cut of all was Crime Dog McGriff's 21 dingers when expectations were in the midthirties. No one reached the century mark in runs scored or RBI. McGriff crossed the plate 91 times and Van Slyke drove in 91 to lead the categories. Van Slyke did manage to lead the SWBA with 14 triples. Another area in which manager Joe Hornback was disappointed was the team's 86 steals, being thrown out 55 times. 1988's 129 team thefts were more to Hornback's liking. The Arrows did have a few pleasant surprises offensively. The LF platoon of Mel Hall and Darnell Coles did very well. Coles batted .290 with 21 HR's in only 283 at-bats. Hall hit a steady .284 in his part-time duty. Rookie Walt Weiss rose above all expectations with his bat, hitting .274 with 56 runs scored. Weiss also had over 35 sacrifice hits and was solid enough to stay near the top of the order most of the season.

The defense was very good. Tony Pena, Weiss, Jose Lind and Van Slyke were very solid up the middle and did all they could to keep the team in a lot of games. Overall, the team committed only 88 miscues, only West Coast and California had fewer errors than the Arrows.

On the mound, Arizona got good performances from Joe Magrane and rookie Melido Perez. Magrane posted a 12-9 record with a 3.16 ERA. He got an average of 4.31 runs per start in support, and was only limited by his innings. Perez finished with a 3.53 ERA, but managed only a 10-14 record mainly due to lack of run support. The Arrows managed only 3.59 runs every time Melido took the hill. Perez also led the team with 3 shutouts. Bruce Hurst got the most run support with 4.90 runs every time he went out, but he struggled at 9-9 due to his 4.61 ERA. The Arrows went in to the season with Jim Gott penciled in as the closer. That didn't last long as he got shelled in the first two rounds and finished the season as a mop-up man. Rob Murphy led the team with 14 saves. Calvin Schiraldi, surprisingly the most consistent man out of the pen in both SWBA campaigns, posted a 6-4 record with 4 saves and a 2.39 ERA.

The Arrows were 22-27 in one-run games and turned in a 3-8 record when the game extended into extra innings. At home, the Arrows were above .500 with a 42-39 record but managed to win only 30 out of 81 road games.

Looking to the next season. The Arrows expect McGriff to bounce back and put up some big offensive numbers. In the off-season, the management picked up some platoon players that have made the team less vulnerable to left-handed pitching. Prior to the draft, the Arrows traded their number one to pick up center fielder Roberto Kelly for his speed and on-base percentage. They also acquired veteran right-hander Rick Sutcliffe to nail down the #4 starter spot.

Wagram Warhawks

The 1989 Warhawks were as much a surprise as the 1988 edition. The '88 Hawks didn't appear that tough on paper, but they were good enough to make the playoffs. In 1989, the pitching looked stronger in the pre-season, but didn't carry through into the regular season, as the Warhawks reversed last year's record, 71-91.

The pitching slid to an ERA of 4.29, with only one regular starter having an ERA under 4.00. Roger Clemens once again led the staff with a 17-16 mark and an ERA of 3.07. He also struckout 295 in 290 innings. Rick Sutcliffe was again a major disappointment with an ERA of 4.91 and a 9-16 record. Sutcliffe is in the Wagram doghouse and may be shipped during the winter for an outfielder or a firstbaseman. Greg Harris was the mainstay in the bullpen with 19 saves while posting an ERA of 2.54. Harris was also second on the team with 10 wins. John Cerutti was the worst pitcher on the staff with an ERA just under 6.00. The pitching was so bad that Andre Dawson made 4 mop-up appearances, and did well, giving up only 11 hits in 8.1 innings and had an ERA of 4.32.

The offense was nothing to write home about either, as the team average was only .259. Homeruns fell from 172 in 1988 to 156 in 1989 and only 5 players had more than 6. Julio Franco was this year's team MVP with a .313 average and 15 homeruns. He also broke the team record by scoring 100 runs. Bobby Bonilla was the only other bright spot going .272, with 37 homeruns and 90 rbi, breaking the team record for homeruns set by Dawson's 36 last year. Team speed was non-existent as the Slowhawks stole only 74 while being caught 47 times. Franco led the team with just 18 swipes. Dawson was just 1 rbi short of topping 100 for the second straight year, while hitting 26 dingers. Dave Henderson added 27 of his own.

The defense didn't help the weak pitching by committing 155 errors. The ironhands at firstbase booted 26 by themselves. That's right, 26 E's at first. Bobby Bonilla added 34 to bring his two-year total to 57. This poor fielding cost the Warhawk pitching staff 102 unearned runs.

Even though Wagram had a disappointing second year, they are looking forward to a good new decade. Wagram will be dipping into the trading market, having some pitching to deal. The Warhawks are looking for a firstbaseman, a leftfielder and possibly a shortstop along with a closer in the bullpen. Rumor has it that along with Sutcliffe, Dawson and Dave Henderson may be on the block. The Warhawks have this year's second overall pick in the draft and are busy scouring over the scouting reports. Wagram is hoping to return to the first division in 1990 and have every intention of doing so!

Delaware Destroyers

If 1988 was as good as they come, 1989 had to be as bad as they come. The Delaware Destroyers, fresh off a World Championship season, fell all the way from first to last in the American Division in one season, finishing with a 67-95 record. There are many things that can be said about the 1989 season — unfortunately, most of them are bad. The power levels for all batters dropped significantly, with home run totals down more than 50% from 1988. The Delaware team which scored nearly 6 runs/game in 1988 had trouble getting 4.5 runs/game. The Destroyers' pitching staff, which wasn't great to start with, didn't improve. Team errors were up 50%.

The only bright spot in this dismal season was the team MVP, Paul Molitor. Molitor had a .351 average with 231 hits, close to Tony Gwynn's SWBA record of 236 hits set last year. Molitor scored a phenomenal 146 runs, an incredible 20% of all Destroyer runs scored in 1989. He also led the team in doubles (45), walks (54) and stolen bases (36). Staff ace, David Cone finished second in the team MVP voting. Cone went 13-11 for the beleaguered Destroyers, throwing 8 CG's and striking out 193 batters. Cone suffered through 6 tough losses, hampering his overall performance.

Season highlights and lowlights: losing three straight to last year's World Series opponent California Coolers in the first series (an omen of things to come), an 11-game losing streak early on which set the tone for the whole season, Harold Baines' 14 errors in right field, Delaware's first shutout...in the 141st game of the season (1-0 over Wagram), a 29-35 record in one-run games, and a heartbreaking 9-8 loss in the last game of the season after hitting two consecutive homeruns.

TRades and roster moves were rare this year. Before the beginning of the season, last year's MVP, Mike Schmidt and reserve catcher Mike Diaz, were traded to Arizona for their talented backstop Andy Allanson. Allanson's stats weren't close to Bo Diaz's of the previous season, but Schmidt's and Mike Diaz's lack of activity during the season made this deal a steal. Stan Jefferson and Bohby Meacham were both released before the trading deadline and Dan Quisenberry and Ron Robinson joined the Destroyers as free agents.

Looking ahead to next year, the offense will be better, but the pitching will still suffer until the younger arms develop their full potential. Steve Sax joins the team and Paul Molitor moves to third base. Allanson, Diaz and Jeff Reed will share catching duties. Don Mattingly will likely start at first, but trade rumors about Mattingly have surfaced. Spike Owen will get most of the time at shortstop. Milt Thompson starts in center field, Harold Baines and Glenn Wilson will share right field and Dave Martinez and Jim Rice will split time in left. The likely starting rotation will consist of Cone, Jim Clancy and a mish-mash of veteran and young arms, including the first left-handed full-time starters in DuPont Memorial. 1990 will be a year of rebuilding, but watch out for the Destroyers in '91!
