

### KODIAK VS. GREENSBORO

#### Game 1

The Hornets jumped on Tom Browning early. Ron Gant and Dave Anderson each hit 2-rbi singles in the 1st inning to give Scott Erickson all the offense he would need. Back-to-back homeruns by Scott Coolbaugh and Dave Justice in the 4th put it on ice after the Aces battled to within one. Chuck Crim was the pitching star in this one. He pitched 3.1 innings of relief, allowing only 1 baserunner and fanning 2 for the save. Justice, Gant and Greg Olson all had three hits to lead Greensboro's 16 hit attack.

Kodiak exploded for 7 runs in the 2nd inning. Dan Pasqua collected 2 hits including a 2-rbi double in the big inning as 11 batters went to the plate. Andre Dawson had a big day. He was 4-5 with 2 rbi on his 1st inning blast off Bobby Witt. Eddie Murray led the Hornets with 3 hits in 4 trips before leaving with an injury. Bill Gullickson yielded only 2 earned runs in 6.2 innings before hitting the showers with the win. Duane Ward finished the game for Kodiak with 1.2 perfect innings.

#### Game 3

Kodiak made it home with the 1-1 split they wanted. Singles and stolen bases gave the Hornets a 2-0 advantage going into the bottom of the 4th. After Lance Parrish walked and Eric Davis singled, Shawon Dunston tripled to tie the game. Glenn Braggs then plated Dunston with a sacrifice fly. Braggs also drove in the 4th run in the 6th with 2 out and runners on 1st and 2nd. Dave Justice led off the 7th with a pinch-hit dinger to make it a one run game, but Storm Davis and Jay Howell shut the door on Greensboro the last 2.2 innings.

The 4-5-6-7 hitters for Kodiak all went 3-4 at the plate. That usually means runs are scored and the Aces put across 8. Wade Boggs was 3-5 in the leadoff spot to make things worse. Tom Candiotti lasted only 2.1 innings, giving up 10 hits and 4 earned runs. Tom Browning scattered 10

hits in 6.2 innings for Kodiak to even his playoff record at 1-1.

Game 5

A capacity crowd turned out to cheer their Aces on in game 5. They could taste their first trip to the SWBA World Series. They were not to be denied. The underdogs scored 5 times in the 4th with Andre Dawson's 3-run homerun being the big blow. That proved to be more than enough as rookie Randy Tomlin fanned 9 batters while giving up 6 hits in 7.2 innings. Duane Ward finished the shutout for John Dougherty's Aces. For the series, Andre Dawson sported the club with a .429 average and 2 homeruns. Hornet Dave Justice was 7-13 with 2 doubles and 3 homers for a .538 average. Both teams hit very well as Greensboro batted .315 and Kodiak .314. The Aces took advantage of their opportunities though, scoring 32 runs to GBH's 19.

Revenge was on the minds of the Garden State Stallions. These two teams met in last year's World Series with the Arizona Arrows coming out on top. Arizona gets solo shots from Fred McGriff, Kelly Gruber and Mackey Sasser in the 2nd inning and continue to build a 7-1 lead through 5-1/2. The Stallions' first 5 batters in the 6th reached base and they didn't quit until they scored 4 runs. Then Mark McGwire's 3-run blast finished off another 4 run inning in the 7th to take a 9-8 lead. Neither team's bullpen survived this game as these two teams combined for 5 doubles and 7 homeruns. Dave Smith was in the wrong place at the wrong time and got the loss. Lee Smith was the pitcher of record when Rex Hudler doubled home the winner in the 8th. Rick Aguilera came on to get the final out and the save.

Mark McGwire was 3-4 with 2 MORE homeruns and 5 rbi. At this point he was 5-7 with 4 homeruns and 9 rbi off the league's leading pitching staff. Wow! This one was over early as McGwire said goodbye to Mr. Spalding with 2 runners on in the first. Mike Morgan scattered 8 hits in 8 innings to get the win for Nick Milford. Nolan Ryan didn't look like an 18 game winner as he was headed for the showers and ice pack

after allowing 6 earned runs in 2.1 innings.

Arrows manager Hornback had faith in his bullpen and big bats though. The pen allowed only 6 hits in the next 10.1 innings to keep GSS from making it a laughter. Barry Bonds lifted a sacrifice fly and Fred McGriff ripped a 2-run shot to bring the Arrows back within one after 7. Von Hayes tied it in the bottom of the 9th, hitting a one out Lee Smith offering over the wall in RF. Von then singled home Jay Bell in the 11th after he reached on Matt Williams' error and moved to second on winning pitcher Bob Kipper's sacrifice bunt. Williams had turned in a great day until that point, he was 3-5 at the platter with a double and 2 rbi.

With none out and two on, Jay Bell fumbled a sure doubleplay ball to open the way for an rbi single by Rex Hudler and 2-rbi double by Greg Myers. The Arrows squandered opportunities in the 1st and 8th innings, leaving the bases loaded in both situations. Ted Higuera, who relieved Bret Saberhagen after 5 innings with the score 0-0, got the win. Jeff Reardon pitched the final 1.1 for the save.

He redeemed his first outing by striking out 9 and allowing only 5 hits in 8 innings. Rob Dibble came on to get the save fanning two of the 3 batters he faced in the 9th. McRae was 2-4 in the game and added a stolen base. George Brett led GSS with 2 hits in 4 trips.

give the Stallions a 6-4 lead in the 7th. Dave Smith gave up 5 hits and 4 runs for the loss. Craig Lefferts tossed the gopher to McGwire and also gave up a homer to Sammy Sosa in 3 batters faced. Garden State's 12 hits were scattered out among 10 batters. Mike Morgan started for GSS, and allowed 4 unearned runs on 2 Matt Williams' errors. Wayne Edwards was on the hill when the Stallions came storming back and got the win. Lee Smith pitched a hitless final 2 innings for the save. McGwire finished the series 7-22 (.318) with 5 homers and 14 rbi. Jay Bell led the Arrows with 7 hits in 20 AB for a .350 clip.

Both teams opened the series with lefties on the hill. Tom Browning got the nod for Kodiak and allowed 8 hits, but only one run in 4.2 innings. Charlie Leibrandt started for Garden State and gave up 5 hits and 1 run in 6.0 innings. Mark McGwire continued his hot hitting. He was 3-4 and drove in the go-ahead run in the bottom of the 7th. After Larry Andersen yielded a one-out triple to Carlos Baerga and an rbi single to Brook Jacoby, Milford brought in Lee Smith. Smith and closer Rick Aguilera sat down the next 5 Aces in order to preserve the victory.

#### Game 2

Rex Hudler, who hit a 2-run shot in the 4th, came up with Darryl Hamilton on first. Hamilton was then caught stealing just before Hudler hit his second dinger of the game. In the bottom of the 9th, Greg Gagne walked and was forced on Hudler's grounder to third. Gino Petralli then lined to short for the second out. Sammy Sosa then singled Hudler to second. Manager John Dougherty brought in Jay Howell to finish it, but a pitch got away from him and Bill Doran ripped it into the gap at Royals Stadium for a game-winning 2-rbi double.

Shawon Dunston's double and Jacoby and Eric Davis' homeruns were the key hits. Charlie Hough got the win, pitching 6 innings allowing 4 hits, 1 walk and 2 runs. Andre Dawson went 3-4 with 2 doubles. Bret Saberhagen got shelled for the loss.

Darryl Hamilton and George Brett each had two hits. For Kodiak, Eric Davis went 3-6 with a double and 2 runs scored. Four other Aces had two hits each. With the Stallions up 4-2 in the bottom of the 9th, Dan Pasqua hit a rocket off of Lee Smith to lead off the inning. Smith had apparently settled down getting Shawon Dunston and Lance Parrish to fly out. Carlos Baerga then stepped to the plate and sent a screaming liner over the left field wall to tie it at 4. Neither team really threatened until the bottom of the 13th when Eric Davis led off with a single. He then stole second and scored on Parrish's two out single off Wayne Edwards.

With the Series all tied at two, the Kodiak Aces took the field with a standing ovation from the sellout crowd. The festive atmosphere was as if the Aces led the Series 3-0. After Bill Gullickson got George Brett to hit into a 543 doubleplay to end the first you'd have thought the Aces had won it all. The place erupted again after Lance Parrish tripled home Brook Jacoby to take a 2-0 lead. The crowd had silenced in the fourth when Greg Myers two-run shot gave Garden State a 3-2 advantage. In the 5th, Shawon Dunston singled and stole second. Bill Gullickson helped his own cause by driving him home. Kodiak broke the tie in the 7th with 3 straight singles by Glenn Braggs, Jack Daugherty and Wade Boggs. Brook Jacoby then ripped a two-out Rick Aguilera offering down the line for a 2 more runs and a 6-3 lead. Duane Ward then got through the final two frames to pick up the save.

Mark McGwire then iced the game with a solo blast to lead off the bottom of the third. Mike Morgan scattered 8 hits in 6.2 innings, giving up 3 runs to get the win. Lee Smith fanned 3 of the 4 batters he faced in the 9th to get the save. Rex Hudler was 3-4 to lead all hitters in this game.

#### Game 7

This WAS the final game. Kodiak got 5 straight singles in the second to take a 2-0 lead. The Aces lost a run as Terry Steinbach was nailed at the plate by Greg Gagne's relay of Dan Gladden's throw. In the bottom of half Gino Petralli doubled and scored on Gagne's single. Juan Samuel then doubled him home to tie it. The Aces came up with 2 more in the 3rd when Andre Dawson led off with a homer and Wade Boggs drew a bases loaded walk. A throwing error by Shawon Dunston allowed Sammy Sosa to score after a leadoff double in the 4th. Two batters later, Boggs booted one that allowed Gino Petralli to score. In the 6th, errors by Boggs and Dunston again led directly to the winning run crossing the plate. The Kodiak Aces set an SWBA World Series record of 5 errors, obviously costing them the championship. The Stallion bullpen did pick up the slack after Bret Saberhagen left giving up 9 hits and 2 runs in 2.2 innings. The Aces got only 1 hit and 1 walk over the last 6.1 innings. Brook Jacoby led the Aces for the Series. He was 12-28 (.429) with 2 doubles, a homer, 7 rbi and 6 runs scored. Darryl Hamilton was Garden State's hot bat, with a 8-17 (.471) mark and 4 runs scored. The Aces pitching held Mark McGwire to 1 HR in 29 at-bats. After being last year's runner up, the Garden State Stallions are the SWBA Champions.

# Greensboro Hornets

Under the leadership of new owner, Larry Taube, and on-field manager, Billy (The Ghost) Martin, the Hornets enjoyed a great 1991 season shattering the SWBA single season win mark with 105 victories. The Hornets finished first in their division, after two great mid-season trades gave them additional firepower for away games.

When Taube acquired the team in 1991, his first decision was to move the team to beautiful Greensboro, N.C. His second decision involved the logjam in right field, with Gwynn, Justice, Tartabull and Baines all on the team. Initially, he felt one could serve as a DH - until he realized that the SWBA required pitchers to hit! What a waste!!! Who goes to a ballgame to watch the pitcher hit or run??? Other than Fay Vincent, of course! Certainly not Lou Piniella, who saw Rijo perform a great slide into second and break his ankle! I mean, what was their collective average in 1991??? .097? That's not baseball!

The team was weak at first, so Eddie Murray was acquired for Tartabull, who had not hit peanuts for the previous three years, and Pete Harnisch (WHO?). The owners forgot that Tartabull was in his option year! Poor decision! But Eddie performed great, batting .334 with 26 dingers in a Hornets uniform. Unfortunately, he only batted .176 in the league championship series - an average you don't want your cleanup batter to ever see! Hence, even though we outhit Kodiak, outhomered and outran them, we lost the series 4 games to 1.

The second great trade landed Ronnie Gant for a pitcher and our first two draft picks. We were trying to wrap up the season with this trade, but Ronnie was something of a disappointment in Greensboro. His .291 average was good, but his 7 homers and lack of timely hitting was unexpected. However, center field is in very capable hands for 1992 and several years into the future!

Pitching was definitely a strong suit for the '91 Hornets! Bud Black and Norm Charlton led the team with 17 wins each, while Tom Candiotti and Bobby Witt contributed 13 and 12 respectively. The team used the bullpen by committee approach, with Greg Harris saving 14 games, Rick Honeycutt 10 and Charlton 8. The 1991 draft was very helpful, with newcomer Scott Erickson contributing a 9-5 record and a 3.71 ERA. The ERA leader was Witt at 2.69 and he was strikeout king with 179 whiffs.

1992 will be another interesting campaign for the Hornets. Weak spots include 3B, a starter to replace Witt, right-handed relief pitchers and a shortstop to hit against lefties - along with no #1 or #2 picks! Strong suits still include right field, with the team planning on moving Baines and either Gwynn or Justice.

# Garden State Stallions

After getting a taste of the World Series in 1990, the Stallions were hungry in 1991. The league's second best pitching staff led Nick Milford's team to 104 wins.

George Brett paced the offense with excellent all-around numbers. He was among the league's best hitters at .326, was up their with 43 doubles, 8 triples and also stole a team-high 30 bases while being caught **ONCE!** He had a .360 OBP and slugged at a .490 clip. Matt Williams was another cornerstone of the balanced offensive attack. The Stallions third baseman batted .260 with 26 doubles, 30 homeruns and led the team with 103 RBI. Mark McGwire anchored the other corner with 98 RBI and team-highs of 92 runs and 45 dingers.

On the mound, six Garden State hurlers broke the 10 win plateau. Charlie Leibrandt and Mike Morgan tied for high honors with 14 wins. Leibrandt (14-9) posted a 3.54 ERA and Morgan (14-11) was right behind at 3.63. Mike Scott also notched a 3.63 ERA with a 13-10 record. Ted Higuera (11-6, 3.24) and Bret Saberhagen (10-2, 2.58) rounded out the regular rotation. The biggest impact on the staff was made by rookie sensation Alex Fernandez. In 14 outings, Alex posted a near perfect 10-1 record, tossing 3 complete games and 2 shutouts. He turned in an unbelievable 0.95 ERA and finished 2nd in Rookie of the Year voting. Fernandez gave up only 6.11 hits per 9 innings, second only in the SWBA to Bobby Witt. With that kind of starting pitching, it looked like there would be no need for relief. Well, the Stallions had an excellent bullpen as well. Lee Smith came over in a trade and finished the season with 34 saves, tied for second in the league. He finished with a 1.98 ERA. Larry Andersen (8-5-10, 2.04) and Rick Aguilera (5-2-20, 2.82) rounded out probably the league's best 1-2-3 combination. Any of the three would have been most team's ace stopper.

Nick Milford was also rewarded with the Coach and General Manager of the Year honors. In two seasons, he has led his team to a .605 winning percentage, best in the league. This victory truly was an all-around performance as no Stallion players were named as first team SWBA All-Stars.

# Arizona Arrows

Anyone that knows this team, knows it was built on hitting. This year was different. The defending SWBA champions came on to lead the league in pitching with a 2.96 ERA. By posting 100 wins, the Arrows would have had the league record in any other year, but this year, 100 wins was good enough only for a wild card playoff spot.

The pitching staff was deep with every pitcher posting a sub-3.90 ERA. Ed Whitson turned in a spectacular season. His "career year" saw him pitch 250 innings, going the distance 8 times with 3 shutouts. He set an SWBA single season win record with 24 victories, while getting the L only 5 times and finishing with a 3.06 ERA. Ed finished 2nd in Cy Young voting. Nolan Ryan was his usual self. He was 18-8 with a 2.38 ERA and 238 K's, finishing 2nd in both categories. The old man completed 8, with 2 shutouts. Number 3 in the rotation was Joe Magrane, who posted a 13-11 record and 3.60 ERA. Danny Darwin anchored the four spot with an 11-8, 2.84 finish. Trevor Wilson solidified the spot starter role going 11-6 with a 3.36 ERA. Manager Joe Hornback called Rob Dibble's number 78 times when the game was close. He responded with a 6-6 record and 34 saves. His 1.45 ERA and 139 strikeouts in 105.1 innings earned him Reliever of the Year honors. His 6.15 hits per 9 innings were third in the league behind Bobby Witt and Alex Fernandez.

The Arrows were still an offensive force. Kelly Gruber, the SWBA All-Star third baseman led the charge with 36 doubles, 32 homeruns, 98 runs scored and was third in the league with 129 RBI. Barry Bonds was tied for 3rd in the league with 110 runs and 89 walks. Barry also added 29 homeruns and 74 stolen bases. Julio Franco batted .289 with 87 walks, 49 steals and 102 runs scored. Fred McGriff added 26 homeruns and 87 walks and finished with a .277 average while being the only Arrow to play in every game. Part-timers Shane Mack, Mackey Sasser and Roberto Kelly all finished above the .300 plateau to do their share. Von Hayes came over from Maine during the stretch run and responded by hitting nearly .300 the rest of the way.

The Arrows future looks bright as well. Jay Bell continues to improve at shortstop and Shane Mack is blossoming into one of the league's best outfielders. Barry Bonds, Julio Franco and Fred McGriff continue to be the framework for success. The team wouldn't mind improving at the catchers, spot and Kelly Gruber's days as an Arrow may be numbered as well. The team really would like to acquire a bonafied lead-off hitter. On the hill, the Arrows will need improvement and will be talking trade. They will also continue to draft prospects to fill key roles in the future.

# Kodiak Aces

The '91 version of the Aces proved to be better than manager John Dougherty expected. Even with the Aces move back to the states from Korea during round 4, they still came away with the Central Division title and a trip to the playoffs. They entered the playoffs with the worst record of the 4 teams and came within 1 game of winning it all.

The Aces were paced by surprising pitching, with Danny Jackson and Storm Davis going 15-5 combined. Charlie Hough again proved to be the ace of the staff, coming in with 16 wins. Tom Browning came in with a 13-7 record and '91 draft choices Bill Gullickson and Randy Tomlin added 18 wins combined. The bullpen was stable most of the time with Jay Howell as the stopper, closing the door on 34 games, and Duane Ward contributing a 9-4 record.

The offense produced the same power as last year with 7 different players putting 13 or more baseballs over the fence with Eric Davis leading the way with 29 HR, 83 RBI. Andre Dawson added 25 HR and 106 RBI to the Aces' cause. Wade Boggs improved on last year's .295 mark by hitting .323 and hitting 13 HR's. His defense was suspect though, with 21 errors at the hot corner. Shawon Dunston also to the Aces' mediocre defense with 26 errors, but put 19 dingers over the fence to offset some of that problem.

The Aces made it to the playoffs with the help of two winning streaks. The first one was an 11 game streak at the end of round 3 that included 4 road wins. The second one was a 10 game streak at the end of round 5 and they proved to be human by losing 6 straight to start round 6, the longest of the season. The Aces proved strong at home in the playoffs winning all 6 games at Fulton County, but could only manage 1 win on the road, which hurt them in the World Series. Still, it was an exciting year for the Aces and their fans. For the Aces to return to the playoffs, they will be looking for defensive help and pitching help. They will look to off-season trades and draft picks to help out.

# Pennsylvania Sluggers

What could have been, didn't quite pan out with what was for the Pennsylvania Sluggers in 1991.

While the Sluggers registered a franchise-best 93-69 record, they were also unable to overcome eventual SWBA champion Garden State for the East Division title or West Division runner-up Arizona for the league's wild-card spot. The result was a second-place finish for the Sluggers (at least it wasn't a fourth consecutive third-place finish) and another fall spent at home instead of in the playoffs.

What stood between the Sluggers and the post-season is up for debate. Manager Chris Dugan would like to believe his team simply picked the wrong year to win 93 games - the most by an SWBA team that failed to make the playoffs. The Sluggers played very consistent baseball and had only two losing rounds - a 15-16 Round 3 and a 10-13 Round 6.

Offensively, Ryne Sandberg had an amazing year. He hit 48 home runs, 40 doubles, drove in 126 runs and stole 36 bases. Sandberg hit 30 home runs in the first 67 games of the season, but faded late in the year and came up two shy of the coveted 50-homer plateau. His batting averages showed something very unusual - Sandberg hit much better against right-handed pitching (.338) than lefties (.246).

Rafael Palmeiro, Lonnie Smith, Dave Winfield and Tony Phillips (37 sacrifice bunts) were several of the players who had big offensive years and helped the team post a franchise-best .268 batting average. Howard Johnson, on the other hand, was somewhat of a mystery. He batted only .238 for the season and hit just .193 (22-for-113 with only three home runs) in road games over the first half of the season.

Johnson and Rick Schu helped put the excitement back into the routine grounder with their play at third base. They combined to commit 63 errors (and you thought your infielders were bad) and their scatter arms forced several spectators seated behind first base at the SkyDome to don catcher's equipment in self-defense. Tony Phillips, however, was better defensively than could ever be imagined and was a key part of the team's success. Sandberg was as solid as ever, committing only four errors.

The pitching staff had its first 20-game winner in Doug Drabek (20-9) and could have had a second had Sid Fernandez (19-9) not run out of innings. Fernandez, however, probably didn't deserve to win 20 games because of his 3.73 ERA and the 23 home runs allowed in only 195.2 innings. Mike Boddicker was a capable third starter while Mike Witt was very effective at 9-6 with a 2.79 ERA. Steve Wilson (9-8) and Jeff Robinson (4-5) were very mediocre in the No. 5 spot.

Randy Myers, after posting a record of 5-11 with only 11 saves and an ERA of 4.87 in 1990, rebounded with a solid season. Myers was 8-4 with 33 saves and an ERA of 2.72. Lefty Scott Radinsky was a pleasant surprise, striking out 65 in 55.2 innings and registering a team-high 17 holds. Myers and Radinsky were two reasons why the Sluggers were 77-2 when leading after 8 innings.

The Scorpions went into the 91 season with lofty expectations after being picked by a preseason prognosticator to be the "Beast of the East" and win the division with a theorized record of 92-70.

However, that goal seemed a long way off at midseason when the Scorpions languished around the .500 mark with a forlorn .241 team batting average. Changes were made, Randy Milligan was given the starting job at first base and the Scorpions caught fire. The Scorpions finished the season by winning 9 out of 10 games which were played by modems from divisional rivals, the Glendale Giants, to finish at 90-72. This record was only good enough for 3rd place in the tough SWBA EAST, the best division in baseball. Still, this 3rd place finish marked the third time in the four years of the league that the franchise finished in the upper division.

Notable highlights included a triple play pulled off at the expense of the Glendale Giants, a 19-13 slugfest win against the San Francisco Seals in which Carlton Fisk hit a grand slam in a seven run inning in the bottom of the eighth, and a modem series win (2-1) against last years champs, the Arizona Arrows. In fact the Scorpions finished with the best head-to-head record against other neighboring AZ managers: (3-3 vs Arrows), (14-4 vs Giants) and (4-2 vs Rambo War\* after Dave Kruper took over).

Key performers during the season included: Carlton Fisk - .280 BA 95 RBI, Randy Milligan - .306 BA, 26 HR, .439 OB, .616 SLG, Kevin Maas - .285 BA, 18 HR, Steve Sax - 48 steals. On the Mound Dave Stewart and David Cone went 17-16 and 16-10 respectively for the Scorpions.

During the season the Scorpions made one controversial trade. They sent bullpen ace, Lee Smith and a number 2 pick to the Garden State Stallions for promising outfielder Mark Whiten and often injured Pete Smith who went on the DL shortly after the trade. The Scorpions are praying for a big year from Whiten to make this trade even out.

Next years starting lineup looks like Fisk and Hoiles behind the plate, Molitor, Milligan and Maas at first, Sax at second, Owen and Belliard at short, Leo Gomez at third. The outfield looks like Dave Martinez, Steve Finley and Albert Belle with Cotto, Whiten, Stubbs and Gilkey in reserve. David Cone looks to be the ace of a bewildered Scorpion staff.

The new divisional realignment brings a tough challenge to the Scorpions with 2 past World Series contestants in the division (Arrows and Triplets/Tempe Tigers). With this in mind, the Scorpions will look to make a few trades during the off-season to clear up the log jam at first base and in the outfield. They will be looking for some additional help at third base and on the mound.

Chris Sabo led in RBI with 100, doubles with 43 and was second in home runs with 22. The biggest disappointment in hitters was Joe Carter, who slumped to 18 HRs and 69 RBI after collecting 41 and 102, respectively, in 1990. Carter also demonstrated that you should not use a player out of position in Pursue the Pennant. Carter played mostly first base and committed a ghastly total of 52 errors. It was no accident that the Grays gave up 1/2 unearned runs per game this year.

On the pitching side, Rijo was the best with a 16-9 mark and posted a 3.00 ERA. Dave Stieb finished at 12-8 with a rotation leading 2.83 ERA. Bobby Thigpen had what might be considered a bizarre season. He finished with a remarkable total of 48 saves, but his final ERA was 4.48. Go figure. Stan Belinda turned in a great year setting up Thigpen. Stan's 2.69 ERA led the Grays' staff while getting 3 wins, 2 losses and a save.

Eric Nordan hoped to improve on the previous win total of 89. With the Central Division up for grabs at the beginning of the year, hopes were high. The Seals, though, fell to 84 victories and finished 9 out of first. With two strong performances, Nordan's Seals have the fourth best winning percentage in the history of the league.

Dave Magadan led the offense with a .317 average. He had 30 doubles and a team-high 5 triples. He also led the team with 70 walks, giving him the league's third best OBP at .401. Kirby Puckett paced the Seals with 39 doubles. He hit .254 with 10 homeruns. Paul O'Neill was solid with a .284 average, 11 homeruns and 69 runs scored. Cal Ripken hit only .237 but led the team with homers (16) and runs (79). Robby Thompson surprisingly tied Ripken with 16 dingers and led the team with 76 rbi.

On the hill, Frank Viola and Zane Smith were the workhorses. They combined for 601.1 innings and 25 of the team's wins. Viola turned in a 3.49 ERA and was second in the league. Dave Stewart in innings pitched with 265.1. Zane Smith tossed a pair of shutouts and was right behind with a 3.58 ERA. The rest of the starting staff was weak leading to an exhausted bullpen. Juan Berenguer was called on a league-high 95 times to pick up the pieces. He managed 7 wins and 13 saves, but was either hot or cold as he was tagged with 10 losses and a 5.19 ERA. Jim Acker was third in the league in games played at 83, but was not adversely effected. He responded with a respectable 4.06 ERA, but sparkled with a 6-1 record and 25 saves.

The Seals are expected to make some deals in the off-season to try to contend for the Carew division title in 1992. We'll see...

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# California Coolers

Prior to the '91 season, Cooler management faced the very real prospect of a 100 loss season if some wheeling and dealing did not take place to shake up the roster. In years past, three or four players acquired by trade was usually the norm, along with drafted players to fill the holes.

Over the winter though, no less than eight new faces joined the Cooler roster. With pitching the priority, four pitchers were added to the staff. Starters Chris Bosio, Jose DeLeon, swingman Tom Gordon and relief pitcher Ken Patterson. Other positions filled were Bob Geren at catcher, Jose Lind at second, Lance Johnson in the outfield and Larry Sheets, bench jockey. After the season started, four more players donned Cooler uniforms, including SWBA All-Star Dennis Eckersley.

Looking to get back to the winning side of the ledger, the Coolers hung tough all season, but fell just short of .500 ball as late season limitations weakened the lineup. Finishing 80-82, California management, although disappointed with the losing record felt progress was made in turning the ball club back into a contender.

Offensively, the Coolers relied on speed, stealing 171 bases, the second best total in Cooler history. Jose Canseco continued to produce, claiming team MVP by bashing out 34 homers, 88 rbi and scoring 85 runs. Team co-captain Tony Fernandez again was a force, tying an SWBA record with 18 triples. Tony also contributed 90 runs, 81 rbi and 28 stolen bases. Lance Johnson and rookie Alex Cole led the stolen base department with 50 and 42, respectively.

Pitching leaders for California were Bosio, 12-6, 3.55 ERA and Gordon 14-8, 3.73 ERA. Bullpen aces Dennis Eckersley and Doug Jones combined for 31 of the team's 45 saves. Inconsistency and sore arms led management to use 16 pitchers during the course of the year.

Next year, management will look to beef up the long ball department to take advantage of Wrigley's "friendly confines" once again. California will also need a catcher while waiting for star-to-be Steve Decker to develop. The Cooler draft will also concentrate on picking up some young and established pitchers in an effort to return to the 1st division.

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# WAGRAM WARHAWKS

The 1991 Warhawks slipped into mediocrity after their promising 1990 campaign. The team batting average dropped 9 points to .267 while the team ERA was slightly better than last year 3.73 versus 3.77. Team speed was almost non-existent as Wagram stole a mere 88 bases. The offense was lead by Bobby Bonilla's team MVP season. Bonilla slammed 44 homeruns and drove in 135 runs, while scoring 102 himself. Giving support to Bonilla in the lineup was Dave Henderson. Hendu smacked 28 dingers, scored 105 runs, drove in 90 and stole 27, even though he only batted 477 times. Henderson also lead the Warhawks regulars with a .321 average. Mel Hall had his second consecutive strong season off the bench, with a .288 batting average. He also contributed 47 RBI's and 12 homeruns, while batting only 379 times. Luis Polonia once again performed well in a leadoff role batting .315, stealing 17 bases and hitting a team high 12 triples. The team pitching improved 4 points in ERA over their 3.77 mark in 1990. Roger Clemens was back to his dominant self, striking out 224 batters and compiling a 1.97 ERA. Although he pitched well he suffered from a lack of support and struggled to a 17-7 record. Bruce Hurst was in the same boat in his first year as a Warhawk, as he did a solid job bringing in a 2.87 ERA, but was only able to amass 13 victories, while losing 7. Greg A. Harris was an adequate third starter, turning in 185 innings and a 3.55 ERA. It was the relief staff that really caused the problems. Eight different pitchers recorded saves, with Dave Righetti leading the way with only 10. There was no dominant closer, although Joe Boever did pitch fairly well, striking out 64 in 77 innings, and recording a 2.70 ERA. Mike Moore flopped from his 20 win season in 1990, to only win 8 and lose 13. He also had an ERA of 5.47. The Warhawks acquired the above mentioned Boever during the season from Glendale for Tim Teufel. This trade turned out well in 1991 and should also be a benefit in 1992. Wagram also sent Nelson Liriano and Felix Fermin to Salt Lake for Scott Fletcher, who contributed a .283 average in 47 games and played a solid second base. Looking forward to the draft the Warhawks will be on their annual search for a catcher and would also be looking for a third basemen and a relief pitcher, possibly a closer. If worse comes to worse Bobby Bonilla may be moved back to thirdbase. The outfield situation seems to be set, with Luis Polonia, Dave Henderson, Bobby Bonilla, Mel Hall and Daryl Boston. Also, the starting pitching seems solid with Roger Clemens, Mike Moore, Greg A. Harris and Bruce Hurst. Mark Eichhorn appears to be slated for the closer role at this time. The Warhawks are looking forward to the draft and the up-coming season.

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# Maine Triplets

Brendan McCormick took over one of the most successful franchises in SWBA history. Unfortunately, he caught them in a rebuilding year. An excellent draft though, kept this team solid for the future. Maine won it all in 1989 as the Tempe Tigers and still reflects the Tiger style.

A lack of starting pitching pretty much made this year a tough one. Greg Maddux was his usual self. He carried the load, pitching 250 innings in 34 starts. He compiled a 14-9 record with 7 complete games, 2 shutouts and a 3.53 ERA. His only help came from Bob Tewksbury. Tewks, limited to 21 outings, finished with an impressive 13-2 mark, with 2 shutouts and basically led the regulars with a 2.12 ERA. He looks to give Maddux even more support in the future. Third round pick Wally Whitehurst appeared in 41 games going 4-2 with a save and 3.47 ERA. First rounder Scott Chiamparino, pegged to be a future star, was 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA in his 6 outings. Tom Henke was his usual self out of the bullpen. He compiled 32 saves and a 2.50 ERA in 65 games. Ken Dayley (7-4-2, 2.87), Mark Grant (1-2-1, 3.66 ERA) and Whitehurst were good as the setup crew. John Franco (6-6-7, 4.26), Mark Knudson (10-13, 4.39) and John Mitchell (4-7, 5.04) were the big busts.

At the platter, Brett Butler and Mark Grace did everything they could to make the team contend. Butler's .394 OBP, .311 BA, 87 steals and 109 runs scored made him a very lethal lead off man. Grace stroked 37 doubles, 7 homers, batted .301 and drove in a team-high 95 runs. The team really lacked power as Mickey Tettleton's 12 led a team that hit only 61 round-trippers. In the past, this team had gotten by with a good on-base percentage, the steal, the sacrifice and the clutch single. This version didn't really have that capability, and had no power to fall back on.

Although Scott Chiamparino hasn't panned out, the Triplets had a strong draft. Charles Nagy, Wally Whitehurst and Pedro Munoz made for good acquisitions. With Tewksbury, Maddux, Kent Hill and Nagy it looks like the starting staff is set for years to come. Most of the players on this team are not superstars, but put up consistently good numbers. That is why this franchise can never be counted out of anything.

Phil Cancel's first year at the helm of the Giants found lots of rough water. After taking over the Philadelphia franchise, he quickly moved them West to the Phoenix Metropolitan area. He decided to go all out on a change of scenery and took Veteran's stadium as home park. The team didn't have much at the plate or on the hill and it made for a long season.

The Giants' lineup was over-loaded with left-handed hitting, making them vulnerable to southpaw pitching. Will Clark turned in a very successful season. He hit for a .301 average, pounded out 15 four-baggers and led the team in doubles with 34 and runs batted in with 87. Kal Daniels socked 21 dingers to lead the team and also led the team with 74 runs and 67 free passes. Junior Felix took advantage of the big bounce on the astroturf in the Vet for 14 triples and a .253 average. Jeff Treadway played well at 2b, hitting .286 with 21 doubles. Andy Van Slyke (.236, 9 HR) and Tony Pena (.229) were great for their veteran leadership, but not much else. The Giants first pick in the draft was a pleasant surprise. Third-rounder Jim Leyritz hit at a .296 clip with 17 doubles and 6 HR in 277 at-bats.

The Giant's best starting pitcher came over in a mid-season trade with the Gulf Coast Humidity. John Burkett finished the season with a 14-11 record and 3.51 ERA. He also managed 3 shutouts on the season. The other 4 starters had a combined ERA of well over 4. Paul Assenmacher was the most consistent hurler on the team. He finished with a team-high 16 saves, and posted a 2.91 ERA in 72 outings. Gene Nelson came over with Burkett and posted good numbers with both squads.

The future looks brighter for the Giants. Pitchers Terry Mulholland, Tommy Greene, John Smoltz, Kevin Brown, Bob Milacki, Melido Perez and Omar Olivares make for a pretty solid staff. Andy Van Slyke, Will Clark, Junior Felix and Darrin Jackson will anchor the offense, but more help is needed. The Giants are on the right track, they just need to get a few more players and a couple of lucky breaks.

# Jersey Shore Tides

The Jersey Shore Tides struggled to a 72-90 record in a season marked by a managerial change near its midpoint. In almost a mirror image of last year, the team played well at home matching its 45-36 home record of 1990, but struggled on the road going 27-54.

The Tides were led offensively by their platooned first basemen. Jack Clark tore up lefties hitting .371 with 22 homers and 74 RBI i 275 at-bats while Hal Morris hit .330 primarily against righties. Kevin McReynolds and Darryl Strawberry each produced fairly well, but needed to have better years for the Tides to move up in the standings. Among the disappointments were Craig Biggio and Robin Yount hitting .243 and .242 respectively.

Pitching was a definite weakness for the Tides. The staff "ace" was Jack Armstrong who finished 11-9 with a 3.04 ERA. The rest of the starting staff was inconsistent all year as was the bullpen. The bullpen did not have a closer. Alejandro Pena saved 17 games, 13 after the managerial change, but had a 5.34 ERA. Michael Jackson pitched fairly well in relief going 7-0.

It looks like 1992 could be another long year for the team. Hopefully with a good draft and possibly some trades, the team will improve. Current management is said to be disenchanted with the large number of current and ex-New York Mets on the team, so trade winds may be blowing. The team will also undergo a name change to the Hannibal Cannibals.

Going into the 1991 season, the big question mark was the starting pitching. Some steps were taken in the draft by picking up Dana Kiecker and Jose DeJesus. Kiecker never came around to meet management's expectations by going 3-11.

Troubled by lack of starting pitching, Steve Farr was called upon to help get the birds off to a flying start. Later, he would be moved to the closer role, becoming the workhorse of the staff. Still maintaining a good ERA of 2.54, he was the most valuable pitcher on the staff.

But, when you ask who the MVP on this team is, once again Kevin Mitchell grabs the award for the second straight year. Sending 46 balls over the hockey glass in left and a decent .286 average say it all. The big three (Mitchell, Ron Gant and Kent Hrbek) combined, hit 95 of the teams 147 homeruns.

To stay out of the cellar and fly to the top, management needs to find more pitching to fix broken wings in the starting rotation. Namely Kiecker and Scott Garrelts. The 'hens also need to replace some power after losing Gant in a trade to Greensboro.

Overall, Minnesota finished 10 games better than last year with more offensive support and slightly better pitching (ERA of 3.94 compared to 4.23 the previous year). The front office feels the Mudhens are heading in the right direction.

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# Tampa Bay Rambo War

The Tampa Rambo War started out very slowly, getting off to a 12-24 record. The old ownership was frustrated with the makeup of the team and finally sold out. The new ownership came in at 36 games played and thought they could compete for 2nd or 3rd in their division. For awhile, the new ownership believed they could win, but after numerous home losses because of a very poor bullpen at mid-season, the new ownership decided it was time to play for next year. However, when the new ownership decided to start trading older veteran players for youth and draft picks, the trading deadline had come and gone. The only move was to cut Tom Niedenfuer and pick up Andy Hawkins as a free agent.

The starting pitching workhorses Dwight Gooden and Bob Welch were 46-13 in real-life, but Gooden was 9-17 with a 4.37 ERA and Welch was 10-9 with a 3.85 ERA. Both were a full run over their real-life ERA's. Two surprises in the rotation were Tim Leary (10-12, 3.52 ERA) and Mike Walker (2-3, 4.44 ERA). Both pitched a lot better than real-life. The bullpen was terrible. The dual closers Lee Guetterman (4-8, 3.88 ERA, 9 saves) and Roger McDowell (4-6, 3.89 ERA, 12 saves) both had losing records. The setup men, Paul Mirabella (2-2, 7.89 ERA) and Clay Parker (2-2, 4.86 ERA, 12 HR in 63 IP), were arson squad men.

Overall, pitching was the downfall for this miserable performance. Team ERA was 4.47, Tampa also allowed 1651 hits in 1464 innings, a very poor ratio.

Hitting, however, was another matter. Ellis Burks had a monster season: .302 BA, 101 runs, 111 rbi, 30 doubles, 7 triples, 33 HR's, .531 slugging percentage. If the Rambo War didn't have Burks, they would have had the worst record in the league. George Bell hit cleanup and the only thing he cleaned up was his dinner plate, or paycheck. Bell hit .257 with only 8 HR and 51 RBI in 479 AB, a major disappointment. Bo Jackson did provide power as expected with 26 HR's, however only a .231 batting average and 55 rbi in 432 AB was disappointing. As a team, the War hit .255 and scored 695 runs with 251 doubles and 133 HR.

In the off-season, the Rambo War have moved to Tempe, Arizona and have been renamed Mesa Mustangs. Also, they have moved their park to Detroit from Cleveland.

The pitching was being evaluated during the off-season and major changes were in order. Most of the pitchers from this year will not be back. Most of the hitters are being replaced also. With a few key deals and a bunch of draft picks, Mesa thinks they can be competitive in the new Clemente Division where hitting is premium and pitching overall is below average.

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# Gulf Coast Humidity

All hitting, no pitching sort of summed up the 1991 Gulf Coast Humidity. After being runners-up in the World Series just two seasons ago, the Humidity sank to an franchise low 62 victories.

Looking at the lineup for this team should send shivers up anyone's spine. Mike Greenwell, Reuben Sierra, Willie McGee, Jody Reed, Dewey Evans, Terry Pendleton and Don Mattingly all know what to do with the Louisville Slugger. Greenwell led the SWBA in hitting for the second time in his career. He batted .356 with 23 doubles, 10 triples, 19 HR, 91 rbi, .407 OBP and .559 slugging percentage. Not far behind was Sierra and his league-leading 52 doubles and team-high 99 ribbies. Willie McGee was the table-setter with a .322 average and 60 stolen bases that converted to 107 runs. Jody Reed was solid at .385 and was tied for 2nd with 45 doubles and was second on the team with 81 runs. This team finished third in the league in batting.

As much as their hitting was hot, the pitching was cold. Only the Oklahoma Switzers and Tampa Bay Rambo War had higher team ERA's. One major problem was a lack of a work horse. No one on the team could start every 4th or 5th day, it was a rotation by committee. When management traded away first round pick John Burkett, the clubhouse needed extra ice machines for all the sore arms. Dennis Rasmussen pitched 169.2 innings with a 5.57 ERA and fortunately lost only 12 games. Ken Howell was the best starter. He did manage 2 shutouts and a 3.19 ERA to finish 6-8. No other pitcher with 100+ innings finished below 4.00. Relievers Reggie Harris (3-3-3, 2.83), Tim Drummond (1-4-1, 3.34) and Willie Blair (3-4-1, 3.71) did their best to keep the team ERA from sky-rocketing any higher. Gene Nelson also pitched very effectively before shipping out to Glendale.

With this offense the future looks bright. Bringing in some fresh young arms and a closer to replace Nelson will be a key. Re-alignment of the divisions for better geographical purposes favors this franchises hopes to return to the post-season.

# SALT LAKE GRIZZLIES

One word can sum up the Grizzlies 1991 campaign; REBUILD! The heads started to roll as soon as the new management moved in as flashy centerfielder Ron Gant was sent packing to Minnesota for the first pick in the SWBA Rookie Draft. The Grizzlies then selected catcher Sandy Alomar, Jr. with the pick, never imagining that he would have to miss over half of the '92 season with injuries and that Gant would keep up his tremendous power display of the past. Also the Grizzlies' other first round pick, pitcher Shawn Boskie, has yet to fill his potential, although Grizzlies' management has not given up on him at this early date in his career.

But on the bright side the '91 season wasn't a total washout, despite the franchise losing 100 games for the second consecutive year. Alomar hit .313 with 21 homers and is deserving of All-Star recognition for his efforts. Vince Coleman batted .306 and stole 75 bases to place among the league leaders in both categories, while Chris James (.293, 11, 66), Sam Horn (.263, 21, 59), Carlos Quintana (.326, 5, 43) and Kevin Seitzer (.260, 14, team leading 76 rbi's while playing all 162 games) fueled the Griz' gas tank. The main problem--Starting Pitching. The Grizzlies received such lack-lustre performances as Tom Glavine's atrocious 7-23 record and 4.83 ERA and had only one regular starter with an ERA under 4.00 (Todd Stottlemire, 3.99). Even in the bullpen, where Gregg Olson was supposed to give Salt Lake an advantage over most teams, failed to live up to expectations. Despite having 28 saves Olson posted a high 4.19 ERA.

Early during the regular season veteran first-sacker Eddie Murray was sent to Greensboro, who were thinking title. The Grizzlies may have received their future. For Murray, pitchers Jimmy Jones & Greg Mathews & outfielder Mitch Webster Salt Lake received slugger Danny Tartabull, hustling outfielder Chris James, outfielder/first baseman Gary Redus & pitcher Pete Harnisch. All four saw significant playing time in '91 and figure heavily in the team's plans for '92.

The '92 season should see the Grizzlies much improved. Having Tartabull healthy all year plus excellent starting pitching in Cy Young Award winner Tom Glavine (can he go from 20 losses to 20 wins in a season?), Pete Harnisch, Todd Stottlemire & bargain-basement Free Agent signee Bill Wegman, as well as having the #2 overall rookie draft pick, could move the Grizzlies up in the standings. But needed will be a catcher to sub for the ailing Alomar, a third baseman, someone who can hit with power to take the slack off of Tartabull and some bullpen help for Olson. Expect the Grizzlies' phone to be active over the winter, as their management never has believed in standing pat.

# Oklahoma Switzers

1991 was the type of season all rebuilding teams must endure before becoming a true contender. Following the 1990 season, the Oklahoma Switzers' personnel directors decided to commit themselves to a complete youth movement. The only flaw in this strategy was that the majority of the young players were not quite ready to play in the majors on a full-time basis. Consequently, the Switzers anticipated just the type of season they had in '91. Losing, and lots of it.

The Switzers won only 11 of 44 series for the year and did not have even a .500 record in any single round. Things started poorly at 10-17 and got worse: 8-14, 8-23, 10-17, 14-18 and 7-16 in the ensuing rounds.

Frank Thomas was the only hitter that was outstanding: .326 BA, 17 HR, 49 R, 51 RBI, 39 BB, .633 SLG, .429 OBP. All this in only 215 AB.

Among the pitchers, Jeff Montgomery was the only standout with 7 wins, 17 saves, and a 2.36 ERA out of the bullpen.

The only excitement in '91 was the performance of Switzers' players in actual major league games. Frank Thomas, Robin Ventura, Juan Gonzalez, Phil Plantier, Steve Avery, Ray Lankford and Jeff Montgomery all had outstanding seasons (or partial seasons).

The Switzers will continue to build around these players as well as newcomers Ivan Rodriguez, Tom Gordon and Jose Oquendo. The future looks much better than the lost 1991 campaign.
